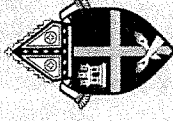

is founded on the belief

**Expect to:**

- Pray and be supported in prayer.
- Discover that you are not alone.
- Begin to restore hope in the future for yourself and your loved one.
- Learn to Let Go and Let God and draw nearer to God.
- Learn about helpful resources and support agencies.

*Path to Peace* is a peer-support group for persons experiencing the pain of a loved-one's addiction - whether it be drug, alcohol, or behaviorally related. It draws on the rich prayer tradition of the Catholic Church, but persons of all faiths are welcome.

Each session offers a time of respite for concerned significant others by centering on God through music, prayer, and prayerful intentions for loved ones.

*Path to Peace* follows two books throughout its course. One reviews the characteristics of addiction, and evaluates positive communication techniques as well as offers suggestions to guide substance misusers into treatment. The second book centers on offering hope, mercy, and spirituality throughout the turmoil of addiction, stressing the importance of building a closer attachment to God.

Participants read a chapter from each book before every session and share their thoughts and concerns only as they wish.
