

Final Sunday Homily as Pastor of Immaculate Conception: July 10, 2022

Joke: The story is told... (taxi driver & priest in heaven) "When you preached, people slept; when he drove his taxi, people prayed!"

Not only have you most likely heard me tell that joke before, but you've also most likely heard all that I'm going to say in today's homily... If you're still awake! "Always remember that the world is a better place because you are in it!"


"Whether you think you can or you think you can't, you'll be right!"
