My dear Sisters and Brothers of Saint Benedict the Abbot Parish:

On April 12, 2015, I called the Church of Pittsburgh to join me in the initiative *On Mission for The Church Alive!*

The goal is to offer a deeper relationship with Jesus and His Church to everyone:

- those actively engaged in the Church;
- those who have lost touch with Jesus or who have left the Church;
- those who have never belonged to the Church, but are seeking deeper meaning in their lives.

For three years, we have labored to discern how to best position our local Church for the future. We must respond to the reality that populations have shifted, that many Catholics have drifted away from Mass, and that we will have fewer priests. We need to share and mobilize our resources to draw people deeper into the faith, seek the lost and serve those in need.

Following prayerful deliberation that included more than 30,000 of our faithful and representatives of your own *On Mission* parish team, together with all of our priests and deacons, I have reached the decisions that I believe will best help us to fulfill our mission as the Church of Pittsburgh. Here are my decisions for your parish:

Your grouping will include the parishes of **Saint Benedict the Abbot, Peters; Saint Francis of Assisi, Finleyville; and Saint Isaac Jogues, Jefferson Hills.**

- The Clergy assigned to this grouping are:
 - Father Robert M. Miller as Administrator.
 - Father Pierre M. Falkenhan, Jr. and Father Robert L. Seeman as Senior Parochial Vicars.
 - Deacon Victor P. Satter
- These clergy assignments become effective on Monday, October 15, 2018.
- This grouping may have up to nine (9) Sunday Masses, including any Saturday Vigil Masses.
- At this time, no church buildings will close.

- Your grouping is expected to work together to form a new parish by the end of 2020 and to recommend which church buildings will best serve the new parish.

I truly believe that change can bring new life and joy. I realize that such transformation is rarely easy, especially in the heartfelt matters of faith and parish life. I know this change will require us to let go of some things that are precious and familiar. I ask you to open your hearts to make new relationships in your grouping of parishes, to create a welcoming community.

Please also pray for your clergy who are moving to new assignments:

- Father Adam C. Potter is appointed Parochial Vicar of Saint Paul Cathedral, Oakland; Saint Regis, Oakland; Saint Rosalia, Greenfield; and Saint Stephen, Hazelwood.
- Father Richard J. Tusky has requested and has been granted permission to begin retirement.


Today marks the beginning of a transition phase that continues through October 15, 2018. During this time of change, I rely on your continued cooperation, understanding and patience.

Your outgoing and incoming clergy will work together for a smooth transition. In the coming months, you will receive interim schedules for Sunday and weekday Masses, confessions, and religious education.
