My Saint is ,St. John the Baptist. I picked him for a similar reason like my sponsor as he did great things in his lifetime, My next part about him St. John is he baptized Jesus in the Jordan river and that was a big impact as when Jesus came out the water Heaven opened up and a spirit of God came down said "This is my own dear son with whom I am pleased" and that for Jesus is important as it marks him the Son of God and important for John to as he continued Jesus path and start his ministry.

In many ways over the past years, I feel like my faith has changed a lot, but me as a person too. For a long time as a kid, if I felt like my faith was never strong, I always thought to myself just pray and what I need God to do happens, but as I got older, I learned more about religion. I think it has brought a whole new meaning to my faith.
