
Weekly Focus

Sight Word: a



This week I introduced word problems and adding small numbers using our fingers and dominoes. These guys are loving this new math unit I hey even helped come up with word problems for each other. An example of a word problem that we used was this: I have 2 red pencils and 3 green pencils. How many pencils do I have? 5! Practice doing word problems at home and be wowed!



This week we learned the letter X. We learned a newer concept called onset and rime. This means I say the first sound of the word and then the rest of the word. For example: /l/...amb, Illiamb. The word is lamb. This is a very tricky concept, so we will continue working on this concept. We also worked on sounding out words to write, like the word dog. This concept the kids did well. Some books we read this week: "National Geographic Kids: Weather," "Singing in the Rain," "Weather Girls," "It Looked Like Spilt Milk," and "Rain, Rain, Go Away."



This week we focused on Holy week. We're excited for Palm Sunday! We learned about Jesus washing his disciple's feet and how he wants us to always help others. We learned that he did that at the Last Supper when they were celebrating Passover. He also introduced the Eucharist. We've also talked about Jesus dying on the cross, but that he rose from the dead on Easter morning! Our saint this week was Saint Peter Claver.
