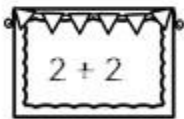

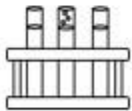
Math

We continued our focus on shapes, more specifically triangle and rectangle. We talked about how both rectangles and squares have four sides and that the square's sides are the same and a rectangle's sides are different. We rolled a dice to see how many pumpkin seeds to put in the pumpkin.
