Teacher Message

Hello K5 parents!

This week we started learning about pumpkins.

Literacy: This week, we are reading stories that help us learn more about pumpkins. We are learning to identify the sequence of the story using the words beginning, middle, and end.

Science: This week, we learned about the parts of a pumpkin. We learned that a pumpkin has a stem, skin, seeds, fibrous strand, and pulp. We made predictions about whether a pumpkin will sink or float and then experimented to find the result. We got to taste some pumpkin things like the cooked pumpkin seeds and some pumpkin pie. It was all delicious!

Religion: This week we learned all about St. Francis of Assisi and the virtue of obedience. We talked about when we are obedient to our parents, grandparents, teachers, etc...we are obedient to God. We listened to the bible story about the Tower of Babel and how God didn't like that they were so proud and wanted to show off so he made the people all speak different languages. Finally, we learned about the sacrament of baptism and what is needed. We learned that Jesus was baptized too. The students got to practice pouring the water and saying the words that are needed to baptize a person.

Math: We finished up our unit on comparing numbers to 5 using the words equal, greater than, less than, more, fewer, and less. We are starting our next unit focusing on numbers recognizing, counting, and writing numbers to 10.
