Teacher Message

Hello K5 Families!

Literacy: This week, we are reading stories that help us learn more about autumn and more about leaves. We are working on making self to text connections with the story, whether it is with our own experiences or with what we have seen in the world.

Science: We learned about why leaves are green during the spring and summer and why they turn different colors in the fall. We learned about a couple big words. Chlorophyll (the food the leaves make from sunlight and makes the leaves green) and pigment (the true color of the leaf that is hidden by the chlorophyll until the autumn). We also learned about the parts of the leaf and went on a leaf scavenger hunt. We had a lot of fun making a leaf pile to jump in.

Religion: This week, we learned about St. John Paul II. We learned about how we have a parish community and that Fr. Michael is in charge of our parish. We talked about things we do as a community, such as, praying together, sharing, serving others, etc.. We read the Bible story about Abraham and Sara and how God promised them 3 things; land, numerous descendents, and a special blessing (Jesus being one of his descendents). We talked about the virtue of humility and how we must not brag to others when we are successful in something.

Math: We are finishing our section that has been working on counting, representing, and writing numbers to 10. Practice counting and writing numbers to 10 with your students at home.
