Dear Friends,

I'd like to take a moment to express my appreciation for all those who had a part in the liturgies of Holy Week — especially those of the Paschal Triduum and Easter. These services were moving and magnificent, thanks to much preparation behind the scenes and a joyful and prayerful attitude on the part of the members of the parish staff and the various liturgical ministries that served; sang; decorated; cleaned; washed; greeted; ushered and collected during the liturgies of Holy Week and Easter. A special thanks to all those who contributed to the Easter Flower Fund in memory of loved ones. My gratitude and prayers for all!

The Second Sunday of Easter was designated by St. John Paul II as Divine Mercy Sunday. It is on this weekend that we are called to reflect upon the mercy and forgiveness of our God, especially as it relates to Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection. Jesus' death on the cross was a beautiful reminder of what God has done for us, sending Jesus to die for our sins as the Lamb of Sacrifice so that we could live ever closer to Him in the new life that He won for us in the resurrection. And so, as we continue to celebrate the mystery of Easter, let each of us remember that we, through our baptism, have died to sin, and have risen to a new life in Christ. Easter is the culmination of everything we believe as Christians and the virtue of Easter is hope. Timothy Cardinal Dolan of New York says the best definition of hope is this: "Hope is the virtue that keeps us going when we are tempted to think that Jesus is asleep." We may be tempted to think the Lord is asleep this Easter given the current crisis and the uncertainty of our future. We might also be tempted to give in to despair and lose hope. Easter calls us to resist such temptations. It celebrates that Christ conquers darkness and despair by his resurrection.

In these days of celebration as we reflect on the power of the Resurrection of Jesus, we always need to ask ourselves what it means for us. In today's Gospel, St. Thomas doubted the Resurrection of Jesus. He needed proof, physical proof. Touching and seeing would be the only things to convince him. It seems that the sight of Jesus is enough, St. Thomas bows and says, "My Lord and my God" - such great words and a deep profession of faith. One that each believer must, in their own life, come to grips with. When we can truly profess Jesus as our Lord and Savior, then we can believe His message for us. What does He do in today's Gospel? He sends the Disciples out into the world. They are to go with a message proclaiming to all the words of St. Thomas: "MY LORD AND MY GOD".

The Holy Spirit that Jesus breathed on those frightened disciples huddled in that Upper Room is the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. The Holy Spirit does not give us a power of fear, but one of strength and faith. He is there to help us in our doubts, fears and weaknesses. But that Spirit works in us if we, like St. Thomas, fall before the Lord and proclaim Him as Lord. If we cannot do that right now in certainty of belief, then we need to fall again before Jesus and ask for the gift of deep faith - to ask the Holy Spirit to remove the doubt or need for "proof" to believe. The proof is certainly around us if we have the eyes to see and the ears to hear. Look around and see the hand of God. Faith in Jesus then calls us to share His love with all the world. Easter reminds us that every Good Friday has an Easter Sunday. With Easter the Risen Christ invites us to share the power of His Resurrection. Each time we love others, we share in the Resurrection. Each time we forgive a betrayal, we share in the Resurrection. Each time we continue to hope – even when our hope seems unanswered – we share in the power of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. In short, the message of Easter is that nothing can defeat us - not pain, sin, rejection or death, not even a pandemic - because the Risen Christ conquers all and we too can conquer them if we put our faith and hope in Christ. As He sends the Disciples out...He does the same for us. Do not be afraid, Jesus did for the eleven as He does for us...He offers His peace. DO NOT BE AFRAID!

We are excited to announce, that the 11am Mass, April 30th will be celebrated by Bishop Richard G. Henning, Coadjutor Bishop of the Diocese of Providence. Following the Mass, the Bishop will bless the "Homeless Jesus Bench" that has been installed in our courtyard.

The Homeless Jesus Bench is created by Timothy Schmalz, a. Canadian sculptor. Timothy Schmalz has been sculpting large scale sculptures in bronze with his works installed worldwide. His most reputed pieces are permanently installed in historical locations in Rome and the Vatican. Replicas of the "Homeless Jesus Bench" have been installed in every continent, in cities such as Buenos Aires, Capernaum, New York, Madrid, Melbourne, Rome and Singapore. In 2019, Pope Francis installed his monument migrant sculpture "Angels Unawares" in St. Peter's Square, the first sculpture to be installed in St. Peter's Square for centuries.

A presentation, by Timothy Schmalz will follow the blessing in the Parish Center and a reception will be held in the Gymnasium.
