
Baptism

Dear Parishioners.

Today we continue our journey through the Christmas Season. We are not yet finished singing our carols and unpacking the implications of God coming among us as a human being. Today's celebration of the Epiphany of the Lord reminds us that God comes to save all people.

The word "epiphany" means manifestation. Today we celebrate the manifestation of Jesus as "King of the Jews" who is recognized by "outsiders," the magi from the east. The "insiders," King Herod and the chief priests and scribes, do not recognize Jesus for who He is. In fact, St. Matthew tells us that they, and all Jerusalem, are troubled by the inquiry of the magi.

But for the magi, this is a journey of great joy and anticipation. When the star they have been following brings them to Jesus, they are overjoyed. St. Paul, in his Letter to the Ephesians more than sixty years later, describes the source of this joy. The mystery that is revealed "was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that the gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel" (Ephesians 3:5-6).

This is no small thing. The one who was named "King of the Jews," by the magi, and who will later be crucified under that same title, is in fact the king of the Jews, but even more, he is the King of all. This child, whom the magi come to offer homage, is the light for all nations (Isaiah 60:1-6).

During the darkest time of the year for those of us who live in the northern hemisphere, and particularly for those of us who live in the northeast, Jesus is revealed as the light who shines in the darkness. On Christmas Day, St. John reminded us that this "light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1:).

This is an important reminder that whatever darkness we may experience - either physical or spiritual, that darkness is no match for the great light of Christ's coming. He does not come to save only a small group of people, but the light of his love and mercy is for all people and all time. Amid an often violent and dark world we need to be reminded that the light of Christ continues to shine. He is the "Word Made Flesh." He is "the Splendor of the Father." He is the "Light of the world," and whatever darkness we experience will never overcome this Light.

May His light shine brightly in our hearts this day and always. And may we share that light, may we be an epiphany, a manifestation of His light to all we meet.


Change in Mass Intention booking for 2025:


