# From the Pastor

Dear Friends,

This past Wednesday, the Church throughout the world entered into the discipline of Lent through the imposition of ashes upon our foreheads. The time of Lent is a time for true conversion. In the first reading from the Mass of Ash Wednesday, we heard Joel issue a prophet's call for true repentance and says that it may be undertaken with confidence, for the Lord is "slow to anger" and "rich in kindness." The marking with ashes upon our forehead reminds us that this penitential sign calls us to use prayer and self-sacrifice as a means of returning to God.

We need this period of Lent as a holy season in which we reflect on the mystery of God and our relationship to him. We need it to rid ourselves of all the excess baggage we carry on life's journey. We need it to place our worldly and otherworldly cares in the hands of God. We have a continual need to be redeemed, to bring about change in our lives, and to turn to God. The call to penance, fasting and almsgiving is the voice of our Lord, Jesus, reminding us to renew our lives. Whatever disciplines we choose to accomplish this, the important question is: How will this lead me to conversion and to renew my baptismal identity and commitment?

Holy Father, Pope Francis said the following regarding Lent: "Lent is a time for remembering. It is the time to reflect and ask ourselves what we would be if God had closed his doors to us. What would we be without his mercy that never tires of forgiving us and always gives us the chance to begin anew? Lent is the time to ask ourselves where we would be without the help of so many people who in a thousand quiet ways have stretched out their hands and in very concrete ways given us hope and enabled us to make a new beginning. Lent is the time to start breathing again. It is the time to open our hearts to the breath of the One capable of turning our dust into humanity. It is not the time to rend our garments before the evil all around us, but instead to make room in our life for all the good we are able to do. It is a time to set aside everything that

isolates us, encloses us and paralyzes us. Lent is a time of compassion, when, with the Psalmist, we can say: "Restore to us the joy of your salvation, sustain in us a willing spirit", so that by our lives we may declare your praise (cf. Ps 51:12.15), and our dust — by the power of your breath of life may become a "dust of love."

I pray that this Lenten Journey will renew your faith and at the end of these forty days, you may feel stronger in your love of God and closer to your neighbor.



In order to ensure objectivity, the Diocesan Catholic School Office's policy requires that parents complete a financial aid application form that may be obtained from the Catholic school the child attends or plans to attend next year. In addition, a letter requesting consideration for assistance must be submitted to Fr. Ledoux no later than April 30th. **Please mark your envelope with Tuition Assistance.** 

- -Families requesting assistance must follow church law on fulfilling the "Sunday" obligation to attend Mass. It should also be by way of exception that a family attends Mass in a parish other than Holy Apostles.
- -At least one parent must be involved in a parish program/ministry.
- -Families must be **regular contributors** to the parish budget using the **weekly** envelopes or through Faith Direct.


