Dear Friends.

This weekend we gather to begin the season of Advent. Advent is a four-week period of patient and joyful anticipation of Christ's coming and it calls us to prepare the way with hopeful expectation of Christ's return. Advent marks the beginning of a new liturgical year for the church. At the beginning of the New Year in January, many of us make New Year's resolutions, for example: we are going to lose weight, give more to charity, and spend more time with family. Perhaps we should consider making Advent resolutions, as so many of us view the holidays as a stressful time. We have a laundry list of things that we feel must get done in order that everyone enjoys the holidays: prepare the presents; get the house ready for the family to visit etc. The church, however, is calling us to prepare and get ready for only one person the Christ Child.

Our late Holy Father Pope Francis stated: "Advent encourages us to reflect on the contrast between our daily routine and the unexpected coming of the Lord. This perspective, he continued, is also an invitation to "sobriety, to not be dominated by the things of this world" but rather to keep them in their proper place. If, on the other hand, we allow ourselves to be overpowered by a concern for material things, we will not be able to perceive what is much more important: our final encounter with the Lord. And so, the Pope said, Advent is "an invitation to vigilance, because, not knowing when He will come, we must always be ready to depart." During Advent, Pope Francis concluded, "we are called to enlarge the horizons of our hearts, to be surprised by the life that is presented each day with its newness. In order to do this, we need to learn to not depend on our own securities, our own established plans, because the Lord comes in the hour which we don't imagine." 11/27/16 Saint Peter's Square

Wednesday, December 3, we celebrate the Memorial of Saint Francis Xavier. Jesus asked, "What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?" (Matthew 16:26a). The words were repeated to a young teacher of philosophy who had a highly promising career in academics, with success and a life of prestige and honor before him. Francis Xavier, 24 at the time, and living and teaching in Paris, did not heed these words at once. They came from a good friend, Ignatius of Loyola, whose tireless persuasion finally won the young man to Christ. Francis then made the spiritual exercises under the direction of Ignatius, and in 1534, joined his little community, the infant Society of Jesus. Together at Montmartre they vowed poverty, chastity, obedience, and apostolic service according to the directions of the pope.

From Venice, where he was ordained a priest in 1537, Xavier went on to Lisbon and from there sailed to the East Indies, landing at Goa, on the west coast of India. For the next 10 years he labored to bring the faith to such widely scattered peoples as the Hindus, the Malayans, and the Japanese. He spent much of that time in India and served as provincial of the newly established Jesuit province of India. Wherever he went, Xavier lived with the poorest people, sharing their food and rough accommodations. He spent countless hours ministering to the sick and the poor, particularly to lepers. Very often he had no time to sleep or even to say his breviary but, as we know from his letters, he was filled always with joy.

As you prepare your homes for Christmas, I invite you to lead your family in the following prayer as you ask God's blessing upon your Christmas Tree.

Lord our God, we praise you for the light of creation: the sun, the moon, and the stars of the night.

We praise you for the light of Israel: the Law, the prophets, and the wisdom of the Scriptures.

We praise you for Jesus Christ, your Son: he is Emmanuel, God-with-us, the Prince of Peace, who fills us with the wonder of your love.

Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we illumine this tree. May the light and cheer it gives be a sign of the joy that fills our hearts.

May all who delight in this tree come to the knowledge and joy of salvation.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. R.
