

Situation: Among former Catholics who are now Protestant, 71% say they left Catholicism because their <u>spiritual needs were not being met</u>, making this the most commonly cited reason for leaving the Catholic Church among this group.

Mission: The St. Thomas More Knight of Columbus (KofC) council will lead and conduct a series of faith-based programs to meet the spiritual needs of Catholic men and to bring men back to the Catholic faith. We will accomplish our mission by providing conferences, small group studies and social events throughout the year.

Vision: To provide a platform for men to increase their faith, to glorify the Kingdom of God and become what God intended men to be; Saints.

Goal: To provide a well-built Faith Based Program that caters to Catholic men and their needs and to continue to earn the KofC Faith award.

It is this council's belief that the building of men's faith and meeting the spiritual needs of Catholic men must be at the forefront of our mission. The KofC council #17996 has created a faith committee that developed a series of conferences and other faith-based events for the fraternal year 2023/2024. These course curriculums are a series of classes/gatherings designed to help Catholic men reach higher levels of faith. These events will be open to ALL men regardless of KofC membership status and are an augmentation to the parishes faith-based programs.

The course topics chosen are believed to be pertinent to man's life and moral issues. The Catholic Basic Training course is our first conference and designed to take us "back to the basics." The following conferences are a continuation that will allow men to grow as we progress through the curriculum; the liturgical calendar was considered as we built this program. Course critiques will be used to evaluate the students experience.

The council would need support for the parish to accomplish our mission and goals. Careful consideration was made when determining what level of support the parish would supply without further tasking an already busy staff. The parish priest and deacons will be encouraged to instruct classes, advertising events via bulletins and verbal announcements at Masses and the meeting spaces reserved within the church would need to be accommodated. The parish will not be asked for any monetary donations but will be encouraged to promote our councils fundraising endeavors.

Back to the Basics Men's Conference Facilitator Tom Melton September 16, 2023

In a busy and chaotic world it's easy for men to fall into the trap of "just going through the motions." It's good to slow down and go back to the basics or fundamentals in all areas of our life. In Revelation, we find the church at Ephesus needed returning to the basics. In Rev 2:4-5, they were encouraged to:

- Remember their first love
- Repent, or stop doing what they were doing, and
- Repeat or do their first works again

This advice really does have application in all areas of life. "Do your first works." It is not enough to stop doing harmful things. You must be proactive and believe in the fundamentals. If we find ourselves struggling in any area, the solution is often found by returning to the basics.

Course description: We will go "back to the basics" and review the Four Pillars of Every Relationship; the Creed (holding on to the faith), Sacraments (expressing the faith), the Moral Life (living faith) and Prayer (praying faith).

The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas.

From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to come back. But the scripture readings during Advent tell us not to waste our time with predictions. Advent is not about speculation. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Lk 21:34-36).

Advent includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas.

Course description: We will explore this powerful liturgical season, taking us on the journey that Mary and Joseph endured after being called by God to be the parents of the Messiah.

Sacrifice for Lent Men's Conference Into the Breach March 2, 2024

(Lent Feb 14-March 28, 2024)

This Lenten sacrifice will be a spiritually motivated voluntary renunciation of a pleasure or luxury that most Christians that we Catholic should do. In this conference, there will be no continental breakfast or lunch, only exceptionally light snacks and water. If you have a special need, plan accordingly.

Years ago, the Knights of Columbus produced a 12-episode video series. Each episode runs 10-13 minutes and focuses on a different aspect of authentic Catholic masculinity, features interviews with well-known Catholic commentators, and follows the personal story of a man whose life illuminates each theme.

This is a call for men to join us in a one-day conference, our LENTEN SACRIFICE. By joining together in brotherhood, men receive the support they need to grow in virtue and to take action to serve Christ and others. Group approach allows us to have a variety of ways to connect men, and allows men to choose their level of involvement and commitment. Below are the course descriptions for the small group classes and are designed to be the "down and dirty" of the topic. Each session is scheduled for 1.5 hours in duration.

Faith and Works

Course description: This course will help give us clarification on what "Good Works" are and gives us a better understanding of the term "Faith without Works is Dead as described in the bible.

Balancing Work Life and Prayer Life

Course description: We will learn how to be available for God and achieving success in our work and family life.

Launch into the Deep

Course description: We will explore why the Eucharist is the source and summit of all its prayers.

The Journey to Bethlehem

Course description: We will explore the long hard excursion from Nazareth to Bethlehem.

From Conception to Natural Death

Course description: We will dive into our Catholic belief that life starts at conception and ends in natural death. We will also discuss the progress of the Life movement.

Book of Isaiah

Course description: The context of Isaiah 41 is about God's help and comfort for the Israelites who followed Him faithfully and the worthless nature of idols. This course will put an emphasis of verses 10-13 focusing on the words "Fear not."

Putting God First

Course description: With so many things that clamor for our attention and devotion: our jobs, our kids, our spouses, our hobbies—the demands and distractions of life we can never let them be more important than our relationship with God. In this course, we will look at ways to make our relationship with God a priority. A simple easy approach.

A Eucharistic Life by Fr. Kapaun

Course description: We explore the life of a Catholic Priest and US Army Chaplin in a documentary made by the KofC.

When God Speaks, We Must Listen

Course description: We will discuss how to hear God speaking to us and the importance of following His instructions.

The Greatest Commandment

Course description: Love is the greatest command. We will discuss how to love as Jesus taught, even how to love our enemies.

The Agony in the Garden to Calvary

Course description: We will explore the events from the Garden to the cross, outlining the highlights and how they affect us every day.

Why Do Bad Things Happen to Good People?

Course description: Bad things happen to people because sin has pervaded every inch of the earth. Due to the fall of man, we are not good people and are not deserving of God's love. We also have an enemy, Satan, who is trying to destroy our lives because he hates that we are made in the image of God. In this course we will learn how to get through those bad times that we don't deserve.

How to Give a Good Confession

Course description: To make a good confession in the Catholic Church, one should first pray and ask God for the grace to make a good confession. Then, examine your conscience and reflect on all the times you sinned against God since your last confession. Let our priest give us the best guidance for a great meaningful confession.

The Rosary

Course description: We will discuss why the Rosary is a mighty weapon and how to push through the challenges of staying focused while praying the Rosary.

Spiritual Warfare

Course description: Prior to creation, there was a war in the heavens among God's other creatures called angels. They are different than humans. Angels are entirely spiritual beings. Although God is Spirit, nowhere do we read that angels were created in the image and likeness of God. This course will focus on the tactics of the devil to shut you down. We will examine Psalms 23, Job and David's journey and the book of Ephesians.

A Call to be Courageous

Course description: See how God can instill courage in your life. We will explore the life's of the most courageous men in the bible.

Why Bad Things Happen to Good People

Course description: We will discuss why God let's bad things happen to good people and focus on the long road of pain.

Battling Demons

Course description: We will learn tactics to disrupt the devils efforts to destroy us.

Instructors/Facilitators

Each instructor will be responsible for their own lesson plans and must conform with the teachings of the Catholic Church. The instructions can be of way of lecture, video or a combination of both and are not to last more than 90 minutes.

The council has selected a committee within the faith program to pre-review periods of instruction and to assist each instructor if needed.

For each period of instruction and course critique and student sign-in must be completed and forwarded to the current program director who will then review and forward to the grand knight. The grand knight will note attendees and the attendee with the most attendance record will receive an award.
