FAQs

If I would like to organize an event through Annunciation Parish, how can I go about doing that?

Parish Event Form If you are planning a fundraiser or event, please submit a Parish Event Form. (You may fill it out online at annunciationevv.org/ParishEventForm). Along with this form, planning guidelines are provided on our website. The Parish Event Form must be submitted and approved at least two months prior to any parish sponsored fundraiser or event. This would include school fundraisers and events. The form can be submitted from the website or downloaded and returned.

Announcements Advertising may be done in a variety of ways. To be included in the Sunday bulletin, on the parish website, and on our social media sites should be submitted to the Parish Center Office. These can be dropped by or emailed to Diana Braun, dbraun@evdio.org.

Use of our facilities If you require parish facilities for a meeting or activity, please contact the Parish Center Office to make sure of availability and to reserve the space. Please see our website for facility use guidelines.

Youth involved? If adults in your group will be working with youth in any way, it will be necessary for these adults to complete Safe Environment Training, and a background check. After the training has been completed, there is a yearly renewal option with the Best Practices Form, which is available on our website at annunciationevv.org/Best-Practices. The safe environment program at the parish is overseen by Evangelization Coordinator, Julie Rosario (jrosario@evdio.org).

Expenses and Income Ministry leaders will have an opportunity to submit their expectations with regards to expenses and income to the Finance Council each year. Please contact the Business Manager in the Parish Center Office for information on reimbursement and other financial policies.

If I would like to engage with a particular ministry, how might I do that?

Vision Committee Meetings Ministries and other parish activities are organized at Annunciation Parish by Vision Committee. Vision Committees meet at least quarterly. Ministry leaders will be asked to contribute to a periodic report to the Parish Pastoral Council via their Vision Committee Chair.

Vision Committee Showcase Ministry leaders are encouraged to participate in the annual parish ministry celebration such as the Vision Committee Showcase Series (as held in the fall of 2017, for instance) and to regularly share information about ministry activities and opportunities for involvement through parish communication outlets.

What should I do if I would like to start a new ministry or if I am a student and am looking for a service opportunity?

Note: If a specific ministry already exists, it would likely be found in the Parish Directory. If a ministry does not exist at Annunciation, please feel free to contact Julie (jrosario@evdio.org) as others may be looking into starting something but do not have the means yet.

Key Terms

We hope the following terms help you navigate our various publications. We also hope it may be a way for us to get a better idea of how we are moved to respond to needs of our parish community and beyond.

Brother: male religious who takes vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience within a particular community (Example: Franciscan brothers/friars of the Renewal from New York)

Charisms: particular gifts that the Spirit distributes “as He wishes” (1 Cor 12:11); orient us toward sanctifying grace and are intended for the common good of the Church (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2003)

Chastity: Chastity means the successful integration of sexuality within the person; the inner unity of humanity in bodily and spiritual being within as well as outside of marriage. (See the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, #2348 and resources through the parish for further background.)

Didache: teaching of Christ’s twelve apostles (See newadvent.com for more background about the teaching and its origin.)

Disciple: one who consciously follows Jesus in the midst of his church community (See page 26 in Sherry Weddell’s *Becoming a Parish of Intentional Disciples*.)

Kerygma: comes from the Greek *keryssein*, to proclaim, and *keryx*, herald; refers to the initial and essential proclamation of the gospel message

Lectio Divina: “divine reading”; reading and praying with scripture in the following steps: *lectio* reading, *meditatio* reflection, *oratio* response, and *contemplatio* rest

Liturgy: from the Greek *leitourgia*, meaning public service; religious worship that includes all of the rites, ceremonies, prayers, and sacraments of the Church, according to their canonical forms; during Mass, there is both Liturgy of the Word when the Gospel is proclaimed as well as the Liturgy of the Eucharist when Christ becomes present in the bread and wine

Maintenance: efforts that push to sustain existing structures at the cost of looking for ways to form disciples and commit to Christ once they’ve encountered Him (See Fr. James Mallon’s book *Divine Renovation: Bringing Your Parish from Maintenance to Mission* for more info.)

Mission: from the Latin *mission*, to send; evangelize and proclaim the Gospel, to ensure that God's grace may touch the heart of every man and of every woman and lead them to him; for every Christian, for the whole Church, this is not an optional mission it is not an optional mission, but essential; our parish's visiting our sister parish St. Suzanne in Haiti to provide financial support and other aid (See more of Pope Francis' statements about the Church's mission in his address to participants in the Meeting of the Pontifical Mission Societies from May 17, 2013, <https://w2.vatican.va/>.)

Monk: a priest or deacon who received the Sacrament of Holy Orders or a brother who is not ordained, living in a monastery; take vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience and partake in a particular apostolate

Nun: woman who belongs to a religious order; takes vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience; lives a cloistered, contemplative life

Poverty: way of expressing or lacking in some thing; often denoting lack in material goods or opportunity; becoming poor, human beings may experience various ways of becoming a beggar who needs to be claimed and saved by Christ Jesus (See Samuel Gregg's article "Pope Francis on the True Meaning of Poverty in *Crisis Magazine* from June 5, 2013.)

Priest: minister of Divine Worship who has been ordained by his bishop and received the Sacrament of Holy Orders; acts *in persona Christi* (in the person of Christ) at the sacrifice of the Eucharist during Mass

RCIA: the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults begins with a person who is attracted to Christ and the Catholic Church. There is a period of Evangelization and Precatechumenate when the individual explores the Christian life and culture. Each one has the chance to inquire, to seek acceptance to be a catechumen. After counted in the Rite of Election when inquirers stand before the parish and claiming to desire to be baptized into the Church at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday, they prepare to be initiated in baptism especially through the period of Lent.

Sacraments: visible signs of invisible grace instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church; in the Roman Catholic Church the seven sacraments include Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, Penance/Confession, Holy Orders, Anointing of the Sick, and Marriage.

Sister: woman who makes simple vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience within a congregation to a local bishop or the pope.

Taize Prayer: prayer modelled by a French community in the 1940s which incorporates chant or other music selections for meditation aid; often may take place before the Blessed Sacrament in Catholic communities

Triduum: period in the Church calendar that follows Lent and comes before Easter Sunday; Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday; a special period of preparation for the Easter season to revisit Christ's Passion
