Appendix A

Stella Maris Guiding Value: Welcoming and Hospitality

Hospitality and being welcoming is more than a coffee hour after mass or putting together a funeral meal. The real practice of hospitality and being welcoming makes people feel they belong. It makes them feel special, important, and warmly welcomed into your life. It receives visitors and those you don't know like they are family. It communicates through your words and actions that others are well worth your time and effort.

When this kind of welcome and hospitality is practiced, we would powerfully communicate the love of Christ throughout our parish.

Christ calls for His church to be welcoming. "So we are ambassadors for Christ, as if God were appealing through us." 2 Corinthians 5:20a. Jesus uses us to be His welcoming arms to draw others closer to Him.

Sherry Weddell shares some pew statistics in her book, <u>"Forming Intentional Disciples"</u>. Only 30% of Americans who were raised Catholic are still practicing (attend mass at least once a month). Another 38% seldom or never attend mass. 32% no longer consider themselves Catholic.

People need to feel comfortable while at church, whether attending mass or a special event or while involved in committee work or volunteering. When they don't feel comfortable they don't attend regularly and when they don't attend regularly they don't feel a sense of belonging and when they don't feel that sense of belonging they may stop coming altogether.

For someone to feel comfortable at Stella Maris, he/she needs to make a connection, build a relationship and feel welcomed. People need to feel this is their church and that they belong. When they feel they belong they also grow in their relationship with Christ.
