Dear Fellow Parishioners of Stella Maris Parish,

With our newest mission/vision statements in mind, our leadership has been focusing our parish on the gospel imperative of discipleship. This church is always charged with and in the process of building the kingdom of God which ultimately transforms the world by means of the power of God's love. Just as biological living involves eating, drinking, sleeping and physical movement; good stewardship involves grateful prayer, spiritual growth, goodness of life, utilizing our gifts and talents to serve the Lord and generously sharing our financial resources.

As baptized Catholics who are committed to Stella Maris Parish, I know I can count on you to grow in your commitment to Jesus Christ as a good disciple and steward. Through that commitment which we live into every week as we participate in the Eucharist; we experience how much God loves us. GOD

1. Accept God's grace unconditionally.

- 4. Spend one hour a month with me in church during the scheduled times.

5. Participate in the Sacrament of reconciliation, at least once a year, preferably twice or however many times are helpful

This sacrament more than any other opens us up to God's grace as we acknowledge we are sinful & unable to do anything spiritual ourselves since we need to be saved and sanctified by God. With its help, spiritual growth becomes more possible and prevalent.

6. Prayer partner

Each person chooses another person to journey with him/her spiritually. The two meet monthly to pray together, share their lives and spiritual experiences and they not only listen and affirm but grow and develop their faith lives better together. More information and guidance will be given when needed.

7. Small group involvement

Every member of the parish should be forming themselves by personal reading and reflection but also by participating in a small group of 6-8 people who together study scripture and other spiritual/theological matters which help their faith to deepen.
