The celebrations of Holy Week are the most sacred moments of the liturgical year. During Holy Week, we hear our most important Scriptures, we celebrate life-changing sacraments, and we are surrounded by ancient gestures and solemn music. These celebrations reveal what it means to be Catholic.

The celebrations of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil from the most important days in our faith each year. These three days are called the Triduum (a Latin word which means "three days"). These liturgies reveal God's love for us.

Easter Sunday ~ April 21 ~8:30 am & 11:00 am
