FIRST READING JL 2:12-18

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Joel

Even now, says the LORD, return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, and weeping, and mourning; Rend your hearts, not your garments, and return to the LORD, your God. For gracious and merciful is he, slow to anger, rich in kindness, and relenting in punishment. A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew Glory to you, O Lord.


