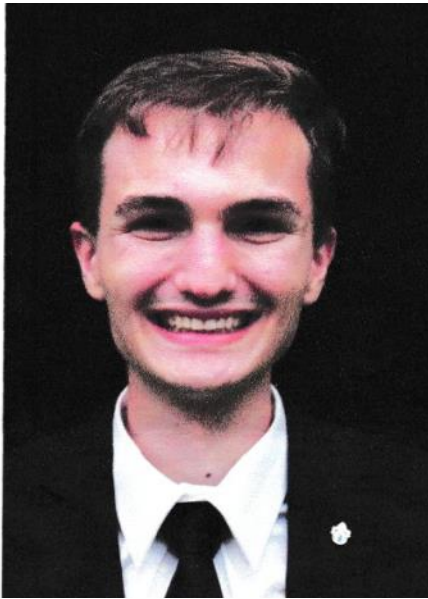
James Gates

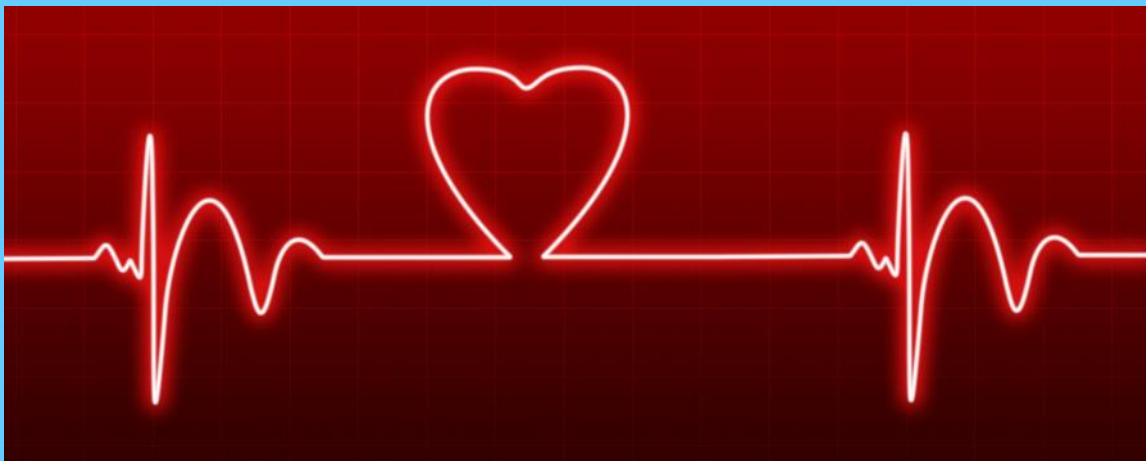
