Habitat Depot in Palmetto

On Tuesday, February 9th, 2021, 7 Knights of Council 13341 teamed together with Habitat for Humanity at the Habitat Depot in Palmetto.

The project team completed the following landscaping tasks:

Set up drop cloths, wooden horses, and mixed several gallons of primer paint to be applied to porch posts.

Filled in defects and final sanded eight (8) wood porch posts for future installation at a new construction site.

Applied one coat of primer paint to the above listed porch posts. Cleaned area. Washed/ cleaned all painting materials, including drop clothes. Stored all equipment, including power sanders, away for future use.

This activity was coordinated by Michael Mahan, Habitat for Humanity Chairman. This represented the 2nd Habitat project in 2021 and cumulatively the 51st project completed in the past 50 monthly projects in a row since January of 2017.




What he is doing now is usurping the role of the bishops and confusing people. He's declaring that he's Catholic, and is going to force people to support abortion through their tax dollars. The bishops need to correct him, as this leader is acting contrary to the Catholic faith.



South Carolina Gov. Henry McMaster (R) signed a bill into law that would ban almost all abortions in the state, the latest state to enact stringent abortion restrictions.

The new law, dubbed the "South Carolina Fetal Heartbeat and Protection from Abortion Act," prohibits abortions if a fetal heartbeat can be detected and mandates that doctors conduct an ultrasound before performing an abortion to see if a heartbeat can be detected. The law contains exceptions for a fetus that is conceived by rape or incest, or if the mother's life is in jeopardy.

Fetal heartbeats can be detected six to eight weeks into a pregnancy, sometimes before a woman is even aware she is pregnant.
