The Catholic Church, and certainly the Knights of Columbus believe the Roe v Wade decision of 1/22/73 must be overturned. On January 18, 2022, our K of C Council 13341 once again made our position on this clear by deploying 125 white crosses on the property of Our Lady of the Angels parish along SR 70 in Bradenton, FL. Roe v Wade must be repealed, and the murder of the innocent must stop. The crosses are meant to make the tens of thousands who will see them during their deployment think and ask what they stand for. To add meaning to the message, each cross represents 500,000 plus lives taken since the Roe V Wade decision was handed down. Council 13341 has sent its message in this manner the past 12 Years.



Habitat Paving the Way!

On Thursday, January 27, 2022, 7 Knights of Council #13341 responded to the Habitat for Humanity Depot located at 1005 3rd Ave. West, Palmetto, and completed the following tasks: - Cleared the parking lot of all debris. - Removed several dozen cement cinder blocks from on top of the paved area and relocated them behind storage containers. - Swept and used gas powered blowers to clean parking lot surface. - Power washed parking lot surface. - Cleaned and stored all tools and equipment. This project is the first of a two-step process to seal the parking lot pavement at a later date. This activity was coordinated by Michael Mahan, Habitat for Humanity Chairman. This represented the 1st Habitat project in 2022 and cumulatively the 61st monthly project in a row (62 total projects over the same time frame) since January 2017



TALLAHASSEE – Florida Senate Republicans on Wednesday advanced a proposal to ban abortions after 15 weeks, rejecting Democratic attempts to soften its restrictions and add exceptions for rape, incest or trafficking.

The bill, which has already been approved by the GOP-controlled House, is now set for a final vote in the Senate after Republicans dismissed a slew of amendments from Democrats. The bill is expected to pass.

The measure comes as Republicans around the country move to <u>limit access to abortion</u> after the U.S. Supreme Court <u>signaled</u> it would uphold a Mississippi law prohibiting the procedure after 15 weeks and potentially overturn the landmark Roe v. Wade decision.


