Our Second Annual Car Show Cook Out October 17th 2020





<u>Habitat Yard Work</u>

On Thursday, October 8th, 2020, 5 Knights of Council 13341 teamed together with Habitat at a rehabilitation home site located at 1638 38th Avenue East, Ellenton, Florida, in the Hope Landing community.

The project team completed the following tasks:

• Pulled weeds in the rear yard. Pulled weeds along the rear, side and front perimeters of the residence. Cleared and weeded the front yard shrub beds.

• Shoveled dirt from front driveway to rear yard. Filled in sunken area in rear yard and graded area where an above ground swimming pool stood prior.

- Removed plastic edging from rear, side, and front yards.
- Bagged and removed all debris from property. Cleaned and stored all work tools in shed.

This activity was coordinated by Michael Mahan, Habitat for Humanity Chairman. This represented the 10th Habitat project in 2020 and cumulatively the 46th monthly project in a row since January of 2017.





On Thursday, October 15th, 2020, 5 Knights of Council 13341 teamed together with Habitat at a rehabilitation home site located at 1638 38th Avenue East, Ellenton, Florida, in the Hope Landing community.

The project team completed the following tasks:

- Installed one large pallet of sod in rear yard in area previously graded and prepared by Knights at a previous work outing.
- Shoveled and installed two (2) yards of shell along entire outside perimeter of residence.
- Planted one (1) tree in front yard.
- Planted approximately fifteen (15) bushes in front shrub beds.
- Installed weed block screening in front shrub beds.
- Shoveled and installed two (2) yards of brown mulch in front shrub beds.
- Shoveled and removed remaining dirt pile in driveway. Dirt taken to neighborhood residence across the street.
- Bagged and removed all debris from property.
- Cleaned and removed all work tools from property.

Removed interior painting materials, including numerous five (5) gallon buckets of paint, and loaded same into vehicles for transportation to, and storage at, Habitat Depot.

This activity was coordinated by Michael Mahan, Habitat for Humanity Chairman. This represented the 11th Habitat project in 2020, second in the month of October 2020, and cumulatively the 46th monthly project in a row since January of 2017.













They need volunteers on Monday through Friday from starting from 8:30 AM to 9:00 AM to no later than noon. You may volunteer as many days as you wish. The only requirement is that your volunteering be the same day(s) every week. If for some reason you cannot volunteer on a day or you have to leave early, you can. In order to be a volunteer, one must complete a short one page application. 
ing food for distribution or distributing the food.
