On Thursday, March 12th, 2020, 12 Knights and 1 Knight's friend of Council 13341 teamed together with Habitat at the Habitat Depot in Palmetto.

The project team completed the following tasks:

- Straightened away and cleaned main entry floor to the warehouse and set up a work area.
- Applied two coats of paint on base molding to be installed at a home under construction in Bradenton.
- Offloaded and stored building materials from vehicle.
- Loaded building materials and supplies in vehicle for delivery to work sites.
- Moved building materials in warehouse to designated areas.
- Cleaned external areas, trimmed bushes, and removed debris around warehouse and containers.

This activity was coordinated by DGK John Joly, the Knights of Columbus Program Director and Habitat Chair. This represented the 3rd Habitat project in 2020 and cumulatively the 39th monthly project in a row since January of 2017.






Shrove Tuesday


Tuesday February 25th 2020

A total of \$560.00 was raised during the event. (100 servings at \$5.00/ serving and \$60.00 in additional donations collected).



Coronavirus Guidelines

March 11, 2020

Dear Fraternal Leader,

The Knights of Columbus is carefully monitoring the coronavirus situation and its impact on the Order. Since the virus is spread by personal contact, containment efforts stress social distancing by restricting travel, meetings and other gatherings. Accordingly, the Supreme Council most strongly recommends the following actions to protect brother Knights and others:

Cancel all personal contact meetings, including business meetings, until further notice.

Cancel all planned events, where people would gather, until further notice.

Cancel all travel for Knights of Columbus business until further notice.

There are many ways to continue council operations without face to face contact. Here are some suggestions:

Conduct meetings by conference call, Skype, Google Groups or other methods.

Use a webinar service for large meetings like monthly business meetings.

Allow member votes by email or text to approve bills and candidate admissions.

Use the email feature of Officers Online for member communications.

Set up a call tree to contact members and ascertain their wellbeing.



Conduct degree ceremonies in homes using the <u>combined Exemplification of Charity, Unity and Fraternity</u> video or the <u>First Degree video</u>.

Use applications like "Go fund me" to digitally raise funds for causes.




