

Catechism Corner

The Greatest Commandments of God

And one of them, a doctor of the Law, putting him to the test, asked him, "Master, which is the great commandment in the Law?" Jesus said to him, "'Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart, and with thy whole soul, and with thy whole mind.' This is the greatest and the first commandment. And the second is like it, 'Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself.' On these two commandments depend the whole Law and the Prophets." (Matthew 22:35-40)



And thus, Jesus declared the totality of God's laws.

• The *greatest and the first* commandment epitomizes the first three of the Ten Commandments.

The second epitomizes the last seven of the Ten Commandments.

To love God, our neighbor and ourselves we must keep the Commandments of God and of His Church, and to perform the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy.

The Spiritual Works of Mercy

There are seven Spiritual Works of Mercy (they are self-explanatory):

To admonish the sinner.
To instruct the ignorant.
To counsel the doubtful.
To comfort the sorrowful.
To bear wrongs patiently.
To forgive all injuries.
To pray for the living and the dead.

The Corporal Works of Mercy

There are seven Corporal Works of Mercy (they are self-explanatory):

To feed the hungry.
To give drink to the thirsty.
To cloth the naked.
To visit the imprisoned.
To shelter the homeless.
To visit the sick.
To bury the dead.



Every Practical Catholic Christian is obligated to perform the works of mercy, according to his own ability and the needs of his neighbor.




