Habitat



On Thursday, August 24th, 2023, 9 Knights of Council #13341 teamed together with Habitat for Humanity at the Habitat Depot in Palmetto to assist with preparing, organizing, and storing building materials for future use in the new construction of 16 single family homes at Polling Gardens.

The project team completed the following tasks:

Moved approximately fifteen (15) door and window bucks constructed out of 2" x 12" pressure treated lumber and steel to clear space to receive lumber delivery. Also moved numerous boxed bath tubs and tub surrounds to new location in rear of the depot.

Received and stored lumber delivery. Lumber delivery consisted of forty-eight (48) 12' pressure treated 2" x 12" boards, twenty-four (24) 10' pressure treated 6" x 6" posts, and twelve (12) each of pressure treated 12' 2" x 6" and 12' 2" x 4" boards.

Moved and stored door and window bucks with lumber delivery.

The work crew was then broken up into two groups. One crew screwed and assembled pre-cut pressure treated 2" x 4"'s to create frames for scaffold platforms. Second crew set up painting station and proceeded to prime and paint pressure treated plywood sheets prior to being affixed to frames.

Frames and plywood sheets screwed together to create twelve (12) 2' x 8', two (2) 2' x 10', and two (2) 2' x 3' scaffold platforms. Once joined together the painting of all assembled scaffold platforms was completed.

Scaffold platforms stored in Habitat Depot.

Paint equipment washed, cleaned up, and stored in Habitat Depot for future use.











First Responders Mass

In his sermon, Father Shawn shared his profound respect for the degree of responsibility expected of our First Responders. This was in part due to his training and experience in the Civil Air Patrol and the Air National Guard. "After the Holocaust in WWII, the Jewish Community developed a phrase, "Never Again". Catechism Corner

Supernatural Virtues

Man is naturally composed of a physical body and a spiritual soul. And while the soul is spiritual and immortal (will never die), it is not supernatural. Heaven is not a natural goal attainable through man's natural powers; it is a supernatural state that demands supernatural powers – from God - for its attainment.

According to St. Thomas Aquinas, Acts tending towards an end must be proportionate to the end. But no act exceeds the proportion of its principle of activity. And hence we see in the things of nature that nothing can produce by its operation an effect which exceeds its active power; it can only produce an effect proportionate to its power. Now, eternal life is an end which exceeds the proportion of human nature, ... and therefore man through his natural powers cannot produce meritorious works proportionate to eternal life. For this kind of action there is required a higher power, which is the power of grace.

To enable us to attain heaven, God gives us a new life principle called *Sanctifying Grace*, and new powers of vital activity called the *Infused Virtues*.

According to Charles Sheedy, the Supernatural Virtues are habits infused into the soul by God, along with Sanctifying Grace, which enable the faculties of the soul to produce acts which are proportionate to the supernatural end. These virtues are infused at the moment when the soul begins to live the Divine Life – normally at Baptism. (While natural virtues facilitate good actions, supernatural virtues make our actions meritorious of heaven.)

There are two sets of Supernatural Virtues: Theological Virtues and Infused Moral Virtues.

The *Theological Virtues are:*

Faith Hope Charity

The meanings of Faith, Hope and Charity are innately understood, due to their infusion by God. In their simplest form they mean, *I believe in God*, *I trust in God*, *and I love God*.

The Infused (Supernatural) Moral Virtues are nominally identical to the Natural/Acquired Moral Virtues (Prudence, Justice, Temperance and Fortitude)— and address the same subject matter; however, whereas the Natural Moral Virtues work on the level of human life, the Infused Virtues work on the new level of Divine Life — and directly assist us in attaining the Beatific Vision.

In summary, God provides natural man with the supernatural power to enable us to attain the supernatural state of Divine Life – through the Supernatural Virtues.
