Memorial Mass


K of C Council 13341 St Cosmas & Damian held our annual Memorial Mass and lunch reception for our past Brother Knights for the fraternal year 2022-2023.




CELEBRATING 1 MILLION COATS

Catechism Corner

Conscience – Part 1

What is conscience? From where does it come? What is pre-infused and what is learned? How does a person form and inform his conscience? Is one obligated to always follow it? Is conscience autonomous? What if a person's belief conflicts with Church teachings? What kinds of consciences are there, and how does one deal with them?

These are several questions for personal contemplation and introspection — especially during our current age of skepticism, moral relativism, narcissism and pervasive cultural darkness. Fortunately, Christ established His Church to help us realize our personal salvation through the agency of the Teaching Authority that He conferred upon His Church — a Magisterial Authority supported by explanations and clarifications developed throughout the millennia by numerous inspired theological scholars, some honored as Doctors of the Church.

Accordingly, the Church's teachings - the Deposit of Faith - are comprehensively described in the non-abridged version of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC).

What is conscience?

According to CCC 1778, Conscience is a judgment of reason whereby the human person recognizes the moral quality of a concrete act that he is going to perform, is in the process of performing, or has already completed." Per CCC 1780 "Conscience includes the perception of the principles of morality; their application in the given circumstances by practical discernment of reasons and goods; and finally judgment about concrete acts yet to be performed or already performed." (What conscience is not: conscience is not a feeling, not a habit, and not a permanent faculty of the soul.)

What is pre-infused into conscience?

According to CCC 1776 Deep within his conscience man discovers a law which he has not laid_upon himself but which he must obey. Its voice, ever calling to him, to love and to do what is good and to avoid evil, sounds in his heart at the right moment...for man has within his heart a law inscribed by God.

Formed and informed conscience.

But conscience must be formed and informed, and moral judgments enlightened. A well-formed conscience is upright and truthful. It formulates its judgments according to reason, in conformity with the true good willed by the wisdom of the Creator. The education of conscience is indispensible for human beings who are subjected to negative influences and tempted by sin to prefer their own judgment and to reject authoritative teachings. (CCC 1783) Education of conscience is a lifelong task that guarantees true freedom and engenders peace of heart. In the formation of conscience the Word of God is the light for our path. We muss assimilate it in faith and prayer and put it into practice... We are assisted by the Gifts of the Holy Spirit, aided by the witness of others and guided by the authoritative teachings of the Church. (CCC 1742)
