
Mother Nikopoia and assistants selected and sized each coat for the children.

St. Michael's Food Bank



Weekly, Council #13341 travels to St. Michael's Church in Wauchula, Fl. St. Michael's parish has a food bank operated by the Sisters of the Servants of the Lord and the Virgin of Matara. The food bank serves 120-300 families a week. The main task is to unload, sort, and store approximately 11,000 pounds of donated food. In addition the Knights complete other pantry tasks.

Wauchula is located in Hardee County which is one of the poorest counties in Florida. St. Michael's parish consists mainly of migrant families.

Many Knights feel this is one of the most rewarding programs at our council. The spirit of charity, fraternity, and unity is displayed every Friday while helping those most in need.

The food was very good and everyone had a choice of Turkey or Spare Ribs with all the fixings and dessert, and all left with a full stomach and a smile


We should never forget our brother knights they helped build our council and put in their time talent and treasures to make the Knight of Columbus a success.


CELEBRATING 1 MILLION COATS

Catechism Corner

Conscience – Part 2

Obeying conscience.

CCC 1782 states, Man has the right to act in conscience and in freedom so as to personally make moral decisions. He must not be forced to act contrary to his conscience. Nor must he be prevented from acting according to his conscience, especially in religious matters." CCC 1790 further states, A human being must always obey the certain judgment of conscience. If he deliberately acts against it, he condemns himself.

Conflicting beliefs.

However, moral conscience can remain in ignorance and thereby lead to erroneous judgments. This ignorance can often be imputed to personal responsibility – such as when a person makes little effort to determine what is true and good. In these cases the person is culpable for the evil that he commits. CCC 1792 advises that *Ignorance of Christ and his Gospel, bad example given by others, enslavement to one's passions, assertion of a mistaken notion of autonomy of conscience, rejection of the Church's authority and her teaching, lack of conversion and of charity: these can be at the source of error of judgment in moral conduct.*

We are thus obligated to form and inform our consciences into being true and upright – and in conformity with the Word of God as taught by His Church. If a person's conscience is either doubtful or in conflict with Church teachings, then he must seek/find/embrace the truth prior to committing himself to specific acts of commission or omission. Faithful clergy and the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* are accordingly most appropriate for spiritual guidance.

Malformed conscience.

In opposition to true and upright consciences there are scrupulous and lax consciences. Both are terribly destructive. In the case of scrupulousness, a person is mentally tortured by his convoluted convictions that just about everything he does is sinful. Such a person should best find a confessor for ongoing guidance until his conscience has been properly reformed.

People with lax consciences, on the other hand, conduct their lives as if practically nothing is morally proscribed, and that just about everything is permissible. They are completely insensitive to the moral gravity of what they do, and are quite willing to push against moral perimeters and beyond. These people are in need of Christian correction – and must learn to suspect their initial judgment of conscience in each case, and to stiffen up their assessments.

Conclusion.

In the end, we will be held accountable for what we purposely do. With a true and upright conscience we will be capable of choosing what is objectively good, while knowing it to be in conformity with the Word of God.
