They gave many tips on how to determine whether to stay or leave and the crucial time frames to watch prior to landfall. If you decide to leave what you would need to take with you and if staying how to prepare and what you should store up on and have cash available, and what paperwork you will need to protect for after the storm. Kay showed short movie clips showing what could happen and gave a slide presentation with all the needed information needed.


