On Tuesday, March 8, 2022, 7 Knights of Council #13341 responded to a residence under rehabilitation located at 811 27th St. Ct. E., Bradenton, FL and completed the following tasks:

Prepared exterior of residence for paint. (Taped off all windows and doors, removed all screens, raked dirt away from foundation, placed tarps where needed).

Painted all exterior walls of residence (15 gals) and front concrete porch (1 gal.).

Removed tape from all doors and windows. Washed all windows and screens.

Raked dirt back to foundation. Placed screens back in windows.

Washed and cleaned all tools, brushes, and equipment, and stored same for future use.





The Knights of Columbus Council 13341 in association with One Blood held a blood drive at Our Lady of Angels Catholic Church on Thursday March 31, 2022 from 12noon - 6pm. One Blood provided two Bloodmobiles which allowed us to have outstanding results. We had 60 donors participating and providing 54 pints of blood to serve our local community. Each donation can save up to three lives, so that means 162 patients could benefit from the lifesaving efforts of the blood donors from this drive. There was rush of donors at the beginning of the event. Donors were sparse towards the end of the event. However, one occasion when there was a

10-minute wait. But, other than that, there was no wait. This event is held approximately 6 times per year. Solicitations were done through the church bulletin (4 Sundays in a row), a poster in the church narthex the Sunday just prior to the drive and through email to Brother Knights and prior donors. Appointments were booked by the donors online. Walk-ups were accommodated. Sign-in and greeting services were provided by 8 Knights on the day of the drive (28 total hours)

As we prepare spiritually for this new liturgical season of Lent, don't forget the temporal. Tempus fugit, memento mori! I am honored to carry on our blessed founder's vision of protecting Catholic families.

Vivat Jesus!



On Tuesday, with virtually no discussion or debate, the Oklahoma House State legislature, voted 70 -14 to pass Senate Bill (SB) 612 "that would make performing an abortion a felony, punishable by up to 10 years in prison."

The author of the bill, State Rep. Jim Olsen said, "Obviously, I'm thrilled because we have the potential of seeing many lives of babies saved." The bill now is headed up to Governor Kevin Stitt and is expected to become law, as Stitt has previously said on the record that "he'd sign any anti-abortion bill that comes to his desk." Should the bill be signed into law, it would become effective this year on August 26.
