Today we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. It is a feast that is very dear to the hearts of all Redemptorists. The Icon and devotion to it have been around for many centuries, but it wasn't until 1867 that From The Desk Of Pope Pius IX asked the Redemptorists to make the icon known worldwide. I think the Redemptorists have done an excellent job with this. In just about every Catholic Church I have ever been in here in the United States, I have seen the icon hanging from one of the walls. I am so

proud that we Redemptorists have been asked to make Mary known in every country.

Some places around the world still hold the icon, and the devotion to it, in very high regard. For example, in Manila in the Philippines, every Wednesday, tens of thousands attend the Novena. There are services around the clock there; what a testament to the faith of the people. But, unfortunately, here in America, weekly devotion to the icon has fallen off dramatically. There was a time in our country when thousands of people gathered every week to pray to Mary and ask her intercession in their lives, but sadly now, few come to Mary and offer her devotion. Maybe it is because our country has become so digital that coming to church during the middle of the week does not sound very inviting.

When I first got assigned here to the Rock, one of my first thoughts was that I wanted to bring more recognition to the icon. Although most churches in American have the icon, none have a shrine to Mary the way we do. I am not sure people appreciate what we have in our church here. I learned recently that here at the Rock in 1922, 99 years ago, the weekly devotion to Mary started right here on the corner of Grand and Cook. No other church in the country had the weekly devotion to Our Lady of Perpetual Help. It started here. Consequently, thousands of people from around the city came here every Tuesday. I have seen pictures of people standing on the street corner after having gotten off the streetcar.

In the next year, I would like to ask everyone here to help me promote devotion to Mary Our Lady of Perpetual Help. Next year, 2022, we will celebrate the 100th anniversary of the weekly Novena. I know we just had a celebration four years ago with the 150th anniversary of the icon being given to the Redemptorists. We have a sacred shrine here. No other church in the whole country can claim to have started the weekly Novena to Mary. We are a National Treasure, and I am hoping to spread devotion to Mary once again. I do not want to have a celebration a year from now; I want to have 100 people at the Novena every week. Hopefully, we can inspire others with this beautiful devotion to Mary. She is the Mother of God, after all.

LITURGY NOTES...



The Gospel of the Lord!

From the beginning, reading from one of the four gospels has been a high point of our Sunday assembling to give thanks and praise. For good reason, too. Christ comes to us in word as well as in deed, in the scriptures as well as in the sharing of his body and blood. And while we know that Godspeaks to us in all of holy scripture, at Masswe are most eager to hear the gospel, the good news of the very words and deeds

of Jesus. (That is what the Old English word "gospel" means after all, "good news," "God's news.").

So when it is time, we jumpto our feet. We acclaim the coming of the gospel with that most ancient and holy of words: Alleluia! (Unless it is Lent, our season of sorrow when we fast from our glorious word just like Israel in exile hung up its harps.) Fast to our feet, singing loud praise, we watch as the deacon (or the priest) takes up the Book of the Gospels. Accompanied by servers with candles, perhaps with fragrant clouds of incense from another server's bowl, the Book of the Gospels makes its way through our assembly from altar to ambo. It sat on the altar from the start of Mass as a sign that Christ is present in the gospel. Now it is taken "up to the heights" to be proclaimed from the ambo, just as Jesus preached the sermon on the mount, or the apostles, drunk with the Holy Spirit, shouted joy from Jerusalem's Pentecost rooftops.

As the deacon or priest announces that this is from Matthew or Mark, from Luke or John, we trace the sign of the cross on our foreheads (may we understand this good news!), on our lips (may we always speak and spread this good news!), and over our hearts (may we love and always live this good news!) Then we listen. We stand together and listen. We stand and listen like a servant being given orders, like an honored guest whose deeds are recounted, like a convicted criminal before the judge's bench, like the beloved being met in haste by the lover. And when it is spoken, when the last word for this day has sunk deep within, the deacon or priest looks to us and says, "The gospel of the Lord!" to whichwe cry, "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!" What else could we possibly say!

Mission Appeal Given By The Missionaries of Our Lady of La Salette




