# The National Eucharistic Revival

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has declared June 19, 2022 to July 21, 2025 as years of the National Eucharistic Revival. Each year of this three-year initiative has a different focus. The focus of the first year is the diocesan renewal, and that of the second year is the parish renewal. At this point, the National Eucharistic Congress will be held in Indianapolis, IN, from July 17 - 21, 2024. This will be followed by the year of going out on mission.

The Eucharist is the healing presence of Christ to the world, something that the world needs during these trying times. Political and religious divisions that polarize our nation, and wars and social strife that threaten the unity and peace in the world need the healing presence of the Eucharist. Christ invites us to unite around the Holy Eucharist, the summit of our faith, in order to heal, renew, and unify the Church and the world. The USCCB calls the National Eucharistic Revival as the joyful, expectant, grassroots response of the entire Catholic Church in the United States to the invitation of Christ.

It is fitting that the National Eucharistic Revival begins each year with the



Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ and culminates in the Solemnity of Pentecost in the following year. Experience of the real presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist fills the people of God with love and zeal to proclaim that experience within their families and communities.

The USCCB invites the faithful to be partners in the National Eucharistic Revival in three different ways: by becoming a prayer partner who joins an army of spiritual warriors and covers the whole revival through prayer, fasting and penance; by sharing how Christ's presence in the Eucharist has touched one's life; by asking the Holy Spirit for inspiration to be part of the revival and encouraging friends and fellow parishioners to do the

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist and Holy Hour are central to the spiritual exercises of the members of the Pallottines. During the first phase of the National Eucharistic Renewal, the Mother of God Province plans to hold retreats, recollections, seminars and devotions to deepen the knowledge, awareness, and experience of the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist.




# Pallottines International

## Marian Health Post, Zambia

Marian Health Post, Westwood, on the outskirts of Lusaka, in Zambia, was started in the year 2019. It was begun in a small room of the Pallottine convent building at the mission station. Today, with God's help that came to us by way of contributions from well-wishers that reached out to us through the Mother of God Province, Milwaukee, we have been able to build a proper structure for the clinic. Some benefactors from Germany were also helpful. In the past three years, this clinic has served more than 7,000 patients. This is besides the 4,000 children who have received life saving vaccinations here.






A laboratory was added to the clinic with the generous contributions received in the loving memory of Leonard and Clementine Chmielewski, and Maurice and Julia Dunbar and their family foundation. The equipment meant for the lab has arrived. Now the challenge is to get a qualified lab technician to work with us.

Yet another addition to the clinic is the ultrasound scanning machine that arrived recently. Thus, a much awaited dream has been fulfilled with the grace of God. #### CHRIST THE KING SCHOOL

Christ the King Middle School serves the children of the Phuvkiu mission station in the Diocese of Kohima. This economically backward area is situated in the Indian State of Nagaland bordering Myanmar. People living here belong to two different tribes: Yimkhiung and Konyak. This three thousand strong community has 143 Catholic families. Agriculture is the mainstay of this community. It is 363 kms away from the nearest town.

This mission station, entrusted to the care of the Indian Pallottines of the Prakash Province in 2016, was established in 1981 by the Diocese of Kohima. When the Pallottines began managing Christ the King School that belonged to the mission station, it had classes up to the fifth grade. Today, it has classes up to the eighth grade. Of the 14 member staff, two are Pallottines.





The 288 students studying here cannot always afford to pay their school fees. This is because the lack of rain had led to failure of crops resulting in their parents' income dropping drastically. The inability of many students to pay their fees is not the only challenge facing this school. The renovation and expansion of the dilapidated wood structure with half walls built in 1981 are long overdue. Bigger classrooms and a hall to conduct skill development programs, adult education classes and school gatherings are the needs of the time.

# The Chef's Corner

## Mom's Meat Stuffing for Turkey



This recipe will probably produce more stuffing than needed for the turkey. This is intentional. Put any left over stuffing in a loaf pan and bake in the oven for about 1½ to 2 hours at 350 degrees F.

It makes a wonderful meatloaf.

#### Here's What You'll Need:

3-4 lbs. ground beef

1 package Jimmy Dean's Original Flavor ground Pork Sausage

½ loaf of fresh 1½ lb. size White

Bread

1 whole celery

2 large onions

Salt and pepper to taste

Sage to taste

2 eggs

Optional: Turkey giblets (heart, liver, cooked)

#### **Here's What You Do:**

Mix ground beef and pork together in a large bowl. Set aside. Using a meat grinder, begin grinding the celery, onions, and bread. If grinding gets hard because of the bread (which tends to dry things out), put in more celery or onions to make things move easier. (Optional: grind in the giblets whenever you want to.) Continue grinding while alternating between the bread, onions, celery

until all ingredients are ground. (Bread will absorb the juice from the celery and onions.)

Combine beef, pork and the bread mixture together. Mix in eggs. Salt and pepper to taste. Sprinkle sage all over top of mixture and mix in well. Put mixture into the turkey cavities and bake the turkey as you normally would. (The stuffing drippings will mix in with the other turkey juices to create a wonderful base from which you can make a marvelous gravy.) Bake leftover raw stuffing in a loaf pan. Enjoy!

Gravy: Put drippings in a large sauce pan or pot on the stove at high heat. Bring to a boil. Put five tablespoons flour or corn starch in a large glass or shaker and mix with water until all lumps are gone and resulting liquid is smooth. Slowly stir into boiling drippings until all fat disappears and mixture starts to thicken. Stir continuously until smooth. If gravy gets too thick add more water. If not thick enough, add more flour mixture. Salt to taste. (When done, strain through a sieve for a smooth, lump-free gravy.)

# Did You Know???

The first Eucharistic Miracle in the Catholic Church was in the eighth century in the city of Lanciano, Italy. A Basilian hieromonk of Lanciano entertained serious doubts about whether the Eucharist constituted the true flesh and blood of Christ. At the monastery of St. Longinus, after saying the words of consecration, ("This is my body. ... This is my blood ..."), the host was changed into live Flesh and the wine was changed into live Blood, which coagulated into five globules, irregular and differing in shape and size. The prodigious Eucharist has undergone four investigations throughout history, beginning with the first objective, a quantitative study in 1574 by Arch-bishop Antonio Gaspar Rodríguez. He conducted a study that weighed the five "globules" of blood in the chalice. Each weighed exactly 15.85g, and all parts together also weighed the same 15.85g. This is considered the "miracle of the weights," and the testing has been repeated at each subsequent investigation with the same results.

In the 18th and 19th centuries, other examinations of the miracle were made, but 20th-century science has given the most conclusive and astounding proof of the miraculous. In 1970, the bishop of Chieti, Italy, charged two doctors and university professors with the task of carrying out a thorough analysis of samples of the miracle. In 1971, Dr. Odoardo Linoli, professor emeritus in human anatomy at the University of Siena, was assisted by Dr. Ruggero Bertelli, a retired professor of human anatomy, pathological histology, at the University of Siena, found that there was no trace of preservatives in the flesh and it was muscular tissue of the heart wall. The blood was also found to be of human origin and of the same type AB blood group as the flesh. They also mention in their 1973 report that blood spoils rapidly when taken from a cadaver, and only a skilled modern surgeon could have removed the tissue sample, ruling out the possibility of a medieval hoax.
