


Touching Base with St. Vincent Pallotti

THE MIRACLES OF ST. VINCENT PALLOTTI

Having received the good news that on September 17, 2016 Elizabeth Sanna, the first lay women member of St. Vincent Pallotti's Union of the Catholic Apostolate (UAC), had been declared "Blessed" by Pope Francis, I began reflecting on the life on Vincent Pallotti himself and his journey to sainthood. I would like to share that journey with you.

In 1852, just two years after his death the process of beatification for Vincent Pallotti was begun. With testimonies and examinations of his writings completed in 1879 and all objections refuted, Vincent was declared "Venerable" in 1887. In 1906 (and again in 1949) his tomb was opened and his body was found incorrupt. After years of investigation of his virtues, on January 24, 1932 Pope Pius XI declared that Pallotti had practiced the divine and moral virtues in an heroic degree.

As the canonization process continued, many events of a miraculous nature that have been attributed to Pallotti's intercession before and after his death have also been recorded and investigated by the Vatican:

every doctor. Her father, who had been miraculously cured by Vincent during his life, believed confidently that Vincent would work a similar miracle for his child He procured a small piece of linen use by Pallotti, together with his picture; the latter he placed on the wall of the sick girl's room and fastened the relic around her neck The child went to sleep, something she hadn't done for some time. and had a dream that her mother took her up to a priest dressed in a cassock with a wide collar and said to him, "Father this little girl of mine is very ill. Please pray that she may get well." The priest said to the girl, "Have great confidence in God." Then he disappeared. When the girl awoke, she told her mother of the dream. The mother, full of hope, asked her how she felt. The girl answered that she was quite well and directly got up to dress herself. She had not been able to walk across the room for two months and was covered with wounds from the efforts she made to escape from those who held her during her convulsions. But now, when she arose, her face had re-

covered its former brightness, and the wounds had disappeared. The doctor, who had been in constant attendance on her, coming to see her, exclaimed, "We are blind and fools! The saints alone can work such miracles." The girl enjoyed perfect health afterwards.

In a different case, on June 6, 1850 a London shoemaker's wife named Anna White was seized with a violent spitting of blood, accompanied with high fever. Four doctors tried in vain to stop it, but at last gave up the case as hopeless. Her husband, in despair, went to call Fr. Raphael Melia, to give her the last sacraments. The priest seeing the distress of her husband and the number of their little children, advised him to invoke Fr. Vincent Pallotti, and to give his wife a few threads of Vincent's clothing in a glass of water, saying three Our Father's, Hail Mary's and Glory be to the Father's in honor of the Blessed Trinity. The poor man did it gladly, and from that moment the bleeding ceased, and his wife was completely cured. The same remedy was tried on one of her daughters who suffered from constant vomiting and she also was instantaneously restored to health.



Then there is the case of ten year old, Alexander Lutri, who fell down a flight of stairs in 1898. At the Santo Spirito hospital he was anointed because it was feared that he would die. As he lay motionless on his bed, blood came from his mouth. The diagnosis of the attending physicians was: severe concussion of the brain and a fractured skull One of them said only a miracle could save the boy. Another said that Alexander had no more than a few hours to live. In this emergency, a certain Signor Blasi, himself a physician, gave the boy's mother a little picture of Pallotti and told her to place it under the boy's pillow and commend her cause to the intercession of Venerable Pallotti The next morning the boy's condition was considerably worse, but the mother did not despair. With the little picture she made the sign of the Cross over the dying Alexander, then put it back under his pillow and continued to pray, despite the physician's statement that death was near. In the evening the little boy was able to move and speak, and to the amazement of all, he was well again the following morning. He told how, during the night, he had seen a man in a religious garb standing at his bedside. When he was shown the picture which had been under his pillow, he declared positively

that it was the picture of the man he saw by his bedside during the night. Alexander Lutri was later present at the beatification of Pallotti on January 22, 1950.

There is also the case of S. R., a lady who suffered terribly from a diseased leg. As she lay in bed at the hospital in Ems, she could not move without help from a nurse. When she stood up, she had to use crutches to walk. The physicians, having treated her for ten months, pronounced her incurable and said that she would remain lame for the rest of her life.

A few weeks later, someone gave her a relic of Venerable Vincent Pallotti. She at once began a novena in his honor, seeking restoration of health through his intercession. On the first day of the novena she felt that the diseased leg, formerly cold and without sensation, had become warm. On the sixth day it straightened, and on the last day of the novena it was completely healed.

In 1947, a Mrs. Margaret Sanders of Nabburg, Bavaria, had been confined to her bed or wheelchair for 17 years, unable, without help, to move her feet or sit up in bed. Intermittently she suffered from fear, trembling and asthma. The doctors declared her condition incurable. She was a member of the Apostolate of the Sick. Its director asked the

members to offer up their prayers and sufferings that a certain girl would be cured through the intercession of Vincent Pallotti. Mrs. Sander felt urged to start a novena to Pallotti for her recovery. Several novenas failed to produced the desired result. Discouraged, she was ready to give up, but at the urging of neighbors and friends she tried it again. This novena was coming to a close on the feast of the Holy Name of Mary, September 12, 1947.

On this day, and the preceding one, she felt much worse. She was seized by an unusual fear, because it seemed that an inner voice told her again and again, "Get up. You can walk!" Afraid she was losing her mind, she finally told a neighbor about it, adding, "Should I try it? But I know I can't walk!" The visitor urged her to try it. She was put in her wheelchair. She prayed, "Vincent Pallotti, help me, with Mary, my Mother, not to fall. In God's name." Whereupon she got up and was able to stand on her feet, the first time in 17 years, and to walk across the room several times She also attended the beatification of Pallotti

Over the years more miracles were forthcoming through the intercession of Blessed Vincent Pallotti and

on January 20, 1963 he was declared a saint by Pope John XXIII in Rome. We celebrate his feast day on January 22nd.



Fr. Joe Koyickal, our Provincial, felt honored for the opportunity to shake hands with the Pope.



Pope Francis Appoints New Pallottine Bishop

On Tuesday October 18, 2016 Pope Francis appointed Fr. Thomas Thennatt, SAC a Pallottine priest of the Nagpur Province in India, as the new bishop of the Diocese of Gwalior in India. He has taken over his new role from the now retired Bishop Joseph Kaithathara.

Bishop Thomas first came in contact with the Pallottines during his high school studies at St. Mary's High School at Kidangoor in the 1960's. He was ordained a Pallottine priest on October 21, 1978.

As a priest he served as an assistant parish priest in several parishes from 1979 to 1981. From 1981 through 1983 he spent his time earning his Masters Degree in Pastoral Theology at the Papal Seminary in Pune.

Having completed his studies he returned to the pastoral ministry as the pastor of St. Anthony Church in the Archdiocese of Hyderabad from

1984-1987 whereupon he became the Director of the Youth Commission and YCS/YSM, Families and Laity. In 1991 he moved to the Diocese of Indore and served there in many capacities until 1998.

In 1998 he was appointed as the Rector of Khrist Premalaya Regional Theologate, Ashta and Director of Regional Commission for Formation, a position in which he continued until 2008.

He was also a consultor of the Prabhu Prahash Province of the Pallottines at Nagpur from 2002 - 2008. In 2008 he became the Pastor of St. Joseph Church of Ishgarh in the Diocese of Jhabua and was President of the CRI Unit Jhabua and a member of the Council of Priests and that of the College of Consultors of the Diocese of Jhabua.

Since 2012 he has been the Pastor of St. Pius X Church in Mankapur in the Archdiocese of Nagpur and President of the Pastoral Commission of the Pallottine Prabhu Prakas Province.

The Pallottines here in Milwaukee wish him many blessings and graces in his new position as a Bishop.

The Cook's Corner

An Old Time Favorite: Monkey Bread

When three people come up with the same idea at the same time, I think that this is an idea that needs to be pursued.

Recently I was given three recipes for Monkey Bread: my own, Betty Mulloy's and Anita Alexander's. Since all are similar, I closed my eyes and picked one. Betty won. So here is her recipe. (Thanks Anita for sending in yours. It is appreciated! Keep sending in those recipes!)

What You Will Need:

2 Tblsp. of Ground Cinnamon.
1 cup granulated sugar
3 tubes refrigerator biscuits
(small ones, not the "Grands")
1/2 cup (1 stick) butter
1/2 cup of powdered sugar
2½ Tblsp. milk
1 bundt or tube pan

Here's What You Do:

Pre-heat oven to 350° F Grease a bundt or tube pan. Mix 2 tablespoons of cinnamon and 1/3 cup of sugar in a small bowl that has a lid.

14 Cut biscuits into quarters



and place in the bowl a few at a time. Cover with lid and shake until biscuit quarters are dusted with the sugar/cinnamon mixture. Place in bundt pan.

Melt butter and add 2/3 cup of sugar to the butter. Spread this mixture evenly over the quarters in the pan.

Bake at 350° F for 30 to 40 minutes.

Turn out of pan onto a serving dish immediately.

Mix ½ cup powdered sugar and 2 ½ tablespoons of milk. Drizzle over bread while still hot. Drizzle will melt a little.

Serve warm, pulling bread apart by the "bubbles" of dough. Very tasty!
