The Catholic sacraments are very special ways that God shows His love for us.



When we receive the sacraments, we receive grace, which is God’s life in us.

## Becoming Part of God's Family



The Sacraments of Initiation –Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist- are the foundations of the Christian life.


Baptism is the birth into new life in Christ. In accordance with the Lord's will, it is necessary for salvation, as is the Church herself, which we enter by Baptism.



- ~Makes us a member of God's family in the Catholic Church.
- ~Is the "door" that gives us access to the other sacraments.
- ~Is a Grace and gift from God
- ~A promise and guarantee of divine protection
- ~We receive remission of original and personal sin
- ~We begin a new life in Christ
- ~We receive the Holy Spirit
- ~Calls us to serve God as a disciple
- ~Baptism imprints a spiritual sign which is impossible to remove
- ~Baptism cannot be repeated

Baptism: The first Sacrament of Initiation by which we are freed from all sin and endowed with the gift of divine life, are made members of the Church, and are called to holiness and mission.

“By Baptism, we share in the redemptive act of Jesus’ death and Resurrection, are freed from Original Sin, and are strengthened against the power of sin and death.

We are reconciled to God and made members of His holy people, the Church.”
