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#### **LET'S GET STARTED!**

Please completely and legibly fill out the 'Confirmation Registration Form' and turn this into us.

As we approach the start of our Religious Education year, you will receive a link to set up an account for you and your Candidate. This account is free, and will give you access to the videos, which accompany the textbook, CHOSEN.

Our preparation program is a family-centered program. We recognize that God is actively present in family life, and that the family is the first community in which God forms His young people. In this way, all family members are engaged in a lifelong faith journey. The schedule for the year is included in the packet. Sunday, in-person family sessions are mandatory (please see our handbook for further information)-the entire family will be present for these sessions (including grandparents/little ones!). For the rest of the month, scheduled lessons will be completed at home. All work in the textbook must be completed fully.

Now is the time to talk to your Candidate about choosing a Sponsor. The 'Confirmation Sponsor Form' is included in this packet and is due to us no later than Jan 21<sup>st</sup>. If the Sponsor is NOT a parishioner of St. Luke's, they must obtain a 'Sponsor Letter' from their **home parish.** 

All candidates must complete (3) service projects (for project #1, #2, a service journal entry must be completed after the end of the service). These forms are included in the packet.

Please note the due dates for the 'Saint Report' (information included in the packet), as well as the letter to Father Jennings requesting the Sacrament of Confirmation, from the schedule. Our Confirmation pilgrimage is mandatory; the Sponsor or parent must attend with the Candidate.

For parents-please note in the packet your homework! 'Letters of Support' are so vital to our Candidates; the outline for these is included in the packet. Please note the due date.

Selecting Your Confirmation Saint Name
Saint Report

Your parents chose a name for you at Baptism; now you will choose a name for Confirmation! This name will be announced at Confirmation. Writing this report will show us how you discerned a saint whose life is important to you.

When selecting a Confirmation saint, you can either choose your Baptismal name (to represent the continued growth connect to your Baptism), or chose a saint who's life inspires you. Sometimes Confirmation candidates often take the name of significant people who influenced their lives, or a name of a patron saint based on their interests, strengths/virtues of that saint. It is okay for a guy to choose a female saint and for a girl to choose a male saint. All Marian names will be listed/announced as Mary.

#### How do you start?

- Pray to the Holy Spirit and ask Him for help in choosing a saint you would like to imitate. Remember: this saint will provide a special bond and they in turn will be praying for you!
- Check out Catholic websites (please avoid Wikipedia): Americancatholic.org, etc.
- Once you have narrowed it down to two, think about which saint you have a special connection...or sometimes you just have to choose!

#### Next....

• Write a report on your saint (12 pt font, double spaced). One page is enough.

#### Questions to reflect on when writing your saint report:

- Why did you choose this saint?
- What contribution to the world did your saint make that resonated with you?
- What is your saint's feast day? For what are they patron saints?
- Was this saint a martyr, and if so why/how did h/she die?
- How old was this saint when they devoted their life to Christ?
- How do you relate to this saint? Are you similar/different?
- Do you think it would be possible today to live out the Christian life this saint promoted?

### Confirmation Preparation Letter to our Pastor, Requesting the Sacrament of Confirmation

When you were Baptized, your parents decided for you, to live and grow as a Catholic Christian. Now, as you about to be Confirmed, it is your decision, to freely respond to God's invitation to live out your faith more deeply—to worship and serve as a Confirmed Catholic Christian.

If you wish to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, write a letter to our pastor, Father Paul Jennings, expressing this desire.

Your letter is due: March 10th

#### **Guidelines for writing this letter:**

Address your letter as follows:

Rev Paul F. Jennings, Jr., Pastor St. Luke's Catholic Parish 14401 Sinepuxent Ave.

Ocean City, MD 21842

- Begin the letter, 'Dear Father Jennings,"
- <u>Paragraph #1:</u> Introduce yourself to Father Jennings: write some things you would like him to know about you.
- Paragraph #2: Begin the paragraph requesting to be Confirmed. Explain how you have been preparing for the reception of this Sacrament: your service projects (and what you learned through doing them), giving more attention to a deeper prayer life, developing your personal relationship with Jesus, etc.
- Paragraph #3: Conclusion: Conclude by: 1) describe what you like about being a Catholic, how you believe you have grown during this preparation process into a greater understanding of your faith, and name one way you believe you can make a difference in this world as a Confirmed Catholic Christian.
- Sign as follows: 'Yours sincerely in Christ," and then sign your complete name.

#### **Letters of Support/Palanca Letters**

There is a tradition that before candidates are confirmed, they receive letters of support and congratulations from their parents, other family members, friends, and Sponsors. Sometimes, these letters are called *Palanca letters*. The word, 'Palanca' is Spanish for 'lever.' Just as a lever enables a person to move something which is beyond normal strength, so the Palanca letters are meant to show the candidate that they are not alone on this journey. They have the support of their loved ones and God. The candidates will receive their letters on their Confirmation pilgrimage.

Letters should be placed in a sealed envelope with the candidates name on it. Please submit all letters of support no later than April 1st.

#### Writing tips:

As you sit down and write your letter, keep these tips in mind:

- Say a quiet prayer to the Holy Spirit. Ask Him to help you say what He wants you to say.
- Simple, genuine encouragement is best. Even brevity is not a bad thing! Don't pressure yourself to write deep or profound thoughts. The best that you can give is to share what the mercy and love of Christ has done for you, and to share this love. Share events in your family life that shows this!
- Don't preach! The good news is that this burden is not on you. Just encourage, build up, affirm, and express confidence in the plans God has for this beautiful young person.
- Share a quote or prayer. There are many powerful and comforting words from Scripture and from the many saints of the Church. Sometimes Google or Pinterest will give you some ideas.
- Assure the recipient of your prayers.
