
## St. Sylvester

No talking

If you leave while the Eucharist is exposed, genuflect on both knees and leave in silence

The priest uses a humeral veil to emphasize that the blessing is by Jesus

The first hour is silent. You may bring a book or pray the rosary if preferred to contemplative prayer.

The purpose of a **patron saint** is that the saint was a living person we can try to emulate who lived a life of surrender to Gods will. A saint name is meant to be an attainable inspiration. Youth are encouraged to get know the lives of the saints. Ask God to guide your youth if they do not have a patron saint yet.



More **curriculum night topics** included: Creation, We are the Body of Christ, Salvation History, The Word Made Flesh, Judgment, Mercy, and Purgatory, The Sacraments, 10 Commandments, 2 church tours, Lent & Triduum

The youth studied the history of the Nicene Creed and why we say it.' The Catechism of the Catholic Church provides a detailed analysis of every part, which is broken down into sections on teachings on the Father; beliefs concerning the Son, Jesus Christ; a theology of the Holy Spirit; and ecclesiology, the description of the distinctive four marks of the Catholic Church. The Creed opens by expressing belief in God the Creator of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. The early Church Fathers thus affirm the basic teaching from Genesis that God, the "unmoved mover" of ancient philosophy, is responsible for the world which we encounter about us each day. 
St. Jerome






We talked about Social Justice and Pro Life Culture. Being **Pro-justice means being Pro-life**. Secular Social Justice Warriors are confused without God.


We focused on the **Real Presence of the Eucharist**, including Mass behavior, appropriate postures, gestures, and dress.


