*Father McGinney is the founder of the Knights of Columbus. He wanted to make sure that no family would become destitute if the breadwinner died. He also wanted to ensure that Catholic men could remain strong in the faith. His legacy continues to inspire the nearly 2 million Knights today. He has been beatified to sainthood. We would like to say this novena to help his cause and to obtain healing for someone to advance Father McGivney's cause.*

*His first miracle, recognized by the Vatican, occurred in 2015 where an unborn child was cured of a life threatening case of fetal hydrops. The parents were given no hope. They prayed to Father McGivney and the baby, Mikey Schachle, is now 5 years old.*

*A second miracle is needed to advance Father McGivney's cause for canonization to Sainthood. Father McGivney died at the age of 38 from influenza thought to be a strain of coronavirus.*
