A few more notes about this list:

Official witness at a marriage would be the priest and or deacon as well as the maid of honor and best man so there are several answers

Sometimes when priests retire they choose to live with family instead of other priests. They are still priests.

Priests and Deacons are the usual minsters of baptism but in a true emergency anyone can baptize a baby by pouring water over their head with the words "I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, Amen."

Only priests can anoint a sick person in the sacrament of the anointing of the sick

Only priests can hear confessions

Deacons as well as priests can celebrate a funeral. If a deacon is the celebrant there can be communion but the hosts will have been consecrated by the priest at an earlier Mass.

Only a priest or bishop can consecrate the hosts and wine allowing the Holy Spirit to transform them into the Body and Blood of Christ. Only a Bishop can officiate at an ordination of new priests and deacons in Holy Orders

A Bishop is the usual conveyor of Confirmation but at the Easter Vigil priests will give sacrament to the newly baptized.
