RELIGIOUS ART SPOTLIGHT

Looking from left to right on the *apse* walls, the second panel depicts the First Joyful Mystery, the Annunciation. The Archangel Gabriel declares to Mary that she is to conceive by the Holy Spirit. Mary kneels among the lilies that symbolize her purity, while the Holy Spirit is present in the form of a white dove. Mary prays, "Behold I am the handmaid of the Lord, let it be done unto me according to your word." Luke 1:38

*The Apse- the semicircular recess behind the altar where the dome and Archbishop's chair are located.



ABOUT OUR CHURCH

- Opened its doors February 14,th1926
- Designed in 1925 by the firm of Jacobberger and Smith
- Home to 400,000 Catholics in the Archdiocese of Portland
- Romanesque style with some Byzantine features
- Covers an area of 12,000 square feet.
- Statues of the Sacred Heart and Blessed Mother were brought in by the Benedictine Monks of Mount Angel.
- The Stations of the Cross and the Povey Brothers dome above the altar date back to 1926
- Other artwork and features were installed either at the time of the 1996 restoration by Archbishop Leveda or in the years since then.

FROM THE RECTOR

Lent starts on Ash Wednesday (2 March). Please join us for Mass at 7:30am, 12:15pm or 5:30pm Ashes will be distributed at all Masses. During Lent new ill celebrate the Stations the Cross each Friday evening at 7:00pm - please come and participate in this beautiful lenten devotion.

If you are looking for some good spiritual reading for Lent, can I recommend *The Fulfillment of all Desire* by Ralph Martin. It is great read about prayer and spiritual growth. Martin uses the writings of 6 Doctors of the Church to explain the life of prayer and how we can use their example to increase in holiness and virtue.

The scaffolding has finally been removed from the bell-tower which is a sign that the water infiltration project for that part of the building is complete. I am working with the facilities committee to determine the next phase of the roof project which should be attempted. Also now that we are confident that the water entering the building has been remedied we will start looking to repair and re-paint the damaged areas inside the cathedral. We also plan to re-lamp the cathedral and clean the pendant lights. I will keep you informed of our progress on these projects.


Security cameras will be installed around the cathedral and in the parking lot at the end of February. We gained a grant from the Archdiocese to pay 50% of this \$15,000 project. The cameras will be a deterrent to crime and will allow us to have recordings of any illegal activity on our property.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

First Reading 1 Sm 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23

In those days, Saul went down to the desert of Ziph with three thousand picked men of Israel, to search for David in the desert of Ziph. So David and Abishai went among Saul's soldiers by night and found Saul lying asleep within the barricade, with his spear thrust into the ground at his head and Abner and his men sleeping around him. Abishai whispered to David: "God has delivered your enemy into your grasp this day. Let me nail him to the ground with one thrust of the spear; I will not need a second thrust!" But David said to Abishai, "Do not harm him, for who can lay hands on the LORD's anointed and remain unpunished?" So David took the spear and the water jug from their place at Saul's head, and they got away without anyone's seeing or knowing or

awakening. All remained asleep, because the LORD had put them into a deep slumber. Going across to an opposite slope, David stood on a remote hilltop at a great distance from Abner, son of Ner, and the troops. He said: "Here is the king's spear. Let an attendant come over to get it. The LORD will reward each man for his justice and faithfulness. Today, though the LORD delivered you into my grasp, I would not harm the LORD's anointed."

Second Reading 1 Cor 15:45-49

Brothers and sisters: It is written, *The first man, Adam, became a living being*, the last Adam a life-giving spirit. But the spiritual was not first; rather the natural and then the spiritual. The first man was from the earth, earthly; the second man, from heaven. As was the earthly one, so also are the earthly, and as is the heavenly one, so also are the heavenly. Just as we have borne the image of the earthly one, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly one.

Gospel Lk 6:27-38

Jesus said to his disciples: "To you who hear I say, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. To the person who strikes you on one cheek, offer the other one as well, and from the person who takes your cloak, do not withhold even your tunic. Give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back. Do to others as you would have them do to you. For if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do the same. If you lend money to

those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, and get back the same amount. But rather, love your enemies and do good to them, and lend expecting nothing back; then your reward will be great and you will be children of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. "Stop judging and you will not be judged. Stop condemning and you will not be condemned. Forgive and you will be forgiven. Give, and gifts will be given to you; a good measure, packed together, shaken down, and overflowing, will be poured into your lap. For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you."

Creed
