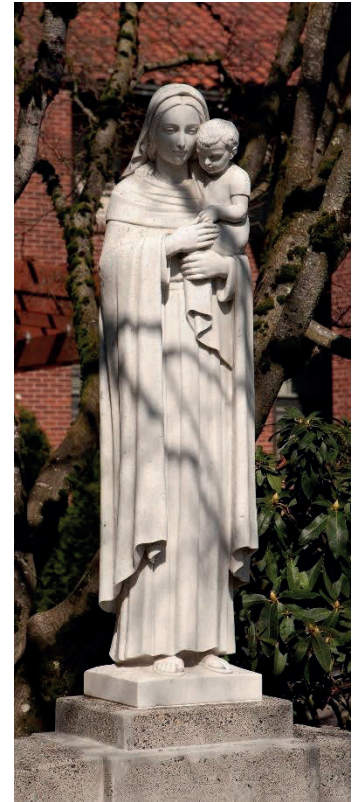

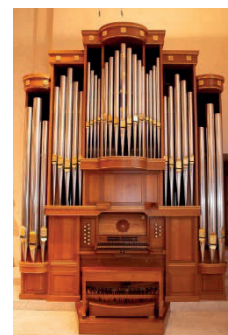
ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT
