SACRAMENTAL GUIDELINES

The sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion, and Confirmation are celebrated at St. Anthony. Special circumstances require permission from the pastors or pastoral administrators of both parishes.

Catechesis for sacraments will take place in the child's family and at St. Anthony parish. Preparation will be supplemented by systematic catechesis in Holy Family schools and St. Anthony religious education program.

Children and youth who will celebrate the initiation sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation are required to participate in Religious Education classes during and one year prior to the celebration of the sacrament.

Children, youth, and parents must participate in all sacramental preparation meetings.

Active participation in the Sunday liturgy by children, youth and their families is a critical component of faith development for any student.

DISCIPLINE POLICY

The respect and dignity of all persons is valued in all St. Anthony Religious Education classes. Every effort will be made to guide children and youth to become self-disciplined persons.

Behavior guidelines will be established for each class. Goal-setting and positive consequences encourage children and youth to choose appropriate behavior.

If there are recurrent or serious problems, the catechist will consult with the Director of Faith Formation. The student will be dismissed from class, according to the following procedure.

1. The student must talk with the Director of Faith Formation before being allowed to return to the class. The student's parent(s) will be notified by phone or online as well.

- 2. In the event a student is sent to the Director of Faith Formation for a second offense, the parent will again be notified by phone or online and a meeting of the student, parents, catechist and Director of Faith Formation will be arranged.
- 3. A third offense by the same student will result in dismissal from classes.
- 4. A review of the decision for dismissal will be made after a meeting with the student, his/her parent(s), the catechist and the Director of Faith Formation.

WEEKLY EMAIL

You can expect a weekly email containing the zoom link, religious formation, and upcoming events. This email is sent to all religious education families on Wednesday. If you do not receive this email, please check your spam folder.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS

Cell phones are not allowed in R.E. sessions unless under the direct supervision of the catechist.

Food, drink and gum are not allowed except under supervision of catechists.

Completion of an *Offsite/FieldTrip Permission Form* and a current *Annual Parental/Guardian Consent* and *Liability Waiver* is required for a child's participation in field trips. Parents are often asked to provide needed assistance with transportation and/or supervision of students. All drivers are required to complete a *Driver Information Form*.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT TRAINING FOR CHILDREN OVERVIEW

Main Points*:

- 1. We are made in the image and likeness of God.
- 2. Our bodies are special because they are Temples of the Holy Spirit.
- 3. No one should touch us in a way that makes us feel uncomfortable, particularly in the places covered by a swimsuit.
- 4. If someone does touch us in a way that makes us feel uncomfortable, we should have someone to whom we can go to get it to stop.

Note: When we need to tell someone that someone has made us feel uncomfortable, we should know who are the faithful friends who can help us and will see us through until we get help.

Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Our Father

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; Thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Glory Be

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Act of Contrition

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Amen.

Apostle's Creed

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

How to Say the Rosary

- 1. Begin with the crucifix and say the Apostle's Creed.
- 2. On the first bead, say one Our Father.
- 3. On the next three beads, say Hail Mary.
- 4. Next say one Glory Be. Then announce and think of the first Mystery and say one Our Father.
- 5. Say ten Hail Mary's and one Glory Be.
- 6. Announce the second Mystery and continue in the same way until each of the five Mysteries of the selected group or decades is said.
