HISTORY OF OUR SCHOOL AND IMPROVEMENTS

The history of St. Leonard School dates back to over 50 years. Ground breaking ceremonies for both the school building (which incorporated a temporary church) and gymnasium took place in the spring of 1956. Within a couple of years the school was completed and opened its doors to grade school children in the fall of 1958. Since its inception, the school has operated with some classes at or near full capacity with now over 1,400 students having had the honor of becoming graduates of St. Leonard School.

Over the years, changes have occurred which added to the educational excellence of the school.

Most notably these changes include:

- Learning Centers
 - Full time reading specialist
 - Math teacher for grades 5–8
- Multi-Media Library with controlled internet access and electronic book check out system
- K4 Program with the option of five full or half-days/week aimed at rooting a spiritual and educational experience from the first day a child starts school
- State-of-the-art Technology with Chrome Books and iPads
- Modern and well-equipped Science Lab
- Lockers for grades 5–8
- Extended after school care

The changes may not have been physically possible without the much-needed space created by the first expansion of our faith, building the present church in 1980. In 2003 a new and well-equipped gymnasium was built. The existing gymnasium was remodeled into classrooms. These plans offer yet another opportunity to increase the educational excellence offered at St. Leonard School.

CURRICULUM

The students at St. Leonard School are provided with a strong foundation in the Catholic religion. Catholic traditions are celebrated throughout the year and include religion classes, weekly liturgies, prayer services, Stations of the Cross and service projects.

We conduct an annual assessment of our academic programs and each year a subject area is targeted to be reviewed in depth.

A balanced literacy approach is used to teach reading. This program integrates self-selected reading, daily writing, phonics and spelling.

Our math program places emphasis on implementing math standards with specific regards to computation, problem solving, algebraic relationships, estimation, geometry and measurement, and probability and statistics.

In science, a discovery-based, hands-on approach is emphasized along with the basic science concepts. St. Leonard School is equipped with an updated science laboratory, which provides students with a safe, modern and fully equipped facility in which short-term and long-term activities can be conducted. Students also have direct supervised access to a computer bank where they can study topics and write research reports.

Grades six, seven and eight are departmentalized so that students change classes for English, Math and Science. This form of specialization has complimented the teaching staff and has been as asset to the pupils. Instruction in Religion, Reading, Social Studies, Art and Spelling are provided by homeroom teachers.

Grades three, four and five change classes for science and social studies introducing them to the junior high experience. Fifth grade also changes classes for Math utilizing the part-time math teacher.

K4 through second grade are self-contained classes with instruction in Religion, Reading, English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Spelling, Phonics and Art provided by the classroom teacher. First and second grade students have the use of a full-time learning center teacher for additional help in reading.

Our part-time teaching staff provides education in Music, Spanish, Physical Education, Computer Technology and Library Skills. Additional help is provided by the classroom teachers and through our Learning Center teachers.

ACTIVITIES

Students attending St. Leonard School have numerous activities in which to become involved. Although most of the activities are offered after fourth grade, there are activities for even the youngest. Some of the activities available to the students are:

Altar Servers	Altar Servers gives students in grades 6-8 an opportunity to enhance their spirituality through participation in Mass.
Athletics	Competitive athletics begins in grade 5 and continues through grade 8. We offer volleyball (fall), basketball (winter), and track (spring), for both boys and girls.
Band	Band instruction is offered to all students in grades 4-8 on a contract basis. Students receive instrumental music instruction in small group lessons offered during the school day on a rotating basis, so the lessons do not interfere with the child's academic performance.
Book Clubs	Lunch and a good book – what could be better? 4 th – 8 th grade students explore the magical world of reading in age-appropriate groups.
Chess Club	Chess Club is open to all students in grades 5-8. This club exposes students to higher levels of thinking while having fun. The club meets once a month and no experience is needed.
Choir	Choir is open to all students in grades 4-8. They sing at the school Masses. For those students who desire to pursue solo and small group performance, extra opportunities will be given.
Modern Woodmen	This is an event that gives students the opportunity to have fun developing and improving their writing and speaking abilities. This is open to students in grades 5-8.
Scouts - Boys	Cub Scouting is a year-round family program designed for boys in grades 1-5. Boy Scouts is available for boys in grades 6-8.
Scouts - Girls	Daisy Girl Scouts are available to girls in K5 and grade 1, Brownies to girls in grades 2 and 3, Juniors to girls in grades 4 and 5, and Cadets to girls in grades 6-8.
Service Opportunities	Grades 1-8 have the opportunity to go with their class one time per year to the Regency Senior Center in Muskego. There they will help seniors with an activity. This activity enhances school and community relations.
Spirit Club	This is a club that is open to St. Leonard Parishioners. It is a way to show students' enthusiasm during an athletic game by wearing their "Spirit Shirt" and cheering for their home team.
Student Council	Student Council gives middle school students the opportunity to develop leadership skills through community service projects and organizing school events. Class representatives and officers are elected by their classmates.
Student Newspaper	Eighth grade students have the opportunity to sharpen their journalistic skills by writing and publishing a semi-monthly school newspaper.
