

HISTORY OF ST. MARY'S (Found in chapter 9 – Page #48) You can find this book at the GF Library. "SAINT MARY'S AND SAINT TIMOTHY'S AND THEIR ECUMENICAL PIONEER PASTOR "(by Rt. Rev. Msgr. M.J. Fletcher)

With the traditional hospitality of the Irish, Father kept a warm and friendly house. There was always room for one more at his dinner table, and if guests were invited he'd be sure to see there was enough to feed the "starving Armenians."

The church dinners under the auspices of the Altar Society were like-wise watched and an extra canned ham was always available "just in case".

The fall dinners and bazaar were held two consecutive nights and were the highlight of the year's activity. The women worked very hard to make it the huge success it always was, but never without Father's admonition to remember that "the people from the community are our guests and must be treated as such by being served first"
