During the flu epidemic of the fall and winter of 1918, all the schools, theaters and churches were closed and public gatherings forbidden by the city officials and health department, in their desperate effort to curb the spread of the highly communicable germ. People were dying like flies and mass burials were held without benefit of rosary or wake. Their bodies were never brought to the church. The graves were blessed, and the dead buried as soon as possible, as all precautions to prevent the spread of the dreaded visitor were taken. Father was the only priest in Greater Grand Forks who did not contract the flu. Almost everyone in town had the dread disease and nurses and volunteers were impossible to be had. The least sick were taking care of the critically ill and Father worked night and day. He not only consoled the sick and administered to the dying of all faiths, but helped the nurses in their care as well.

Father was one of the prime organizers of the Greater Grand Forks Ministerial Association, and held an office in the organization for many years. He took a very active and guiding part in all its activities and movements and formed many strong bonds of lasting friendship with other clergymen of the two cities.

In 1938 Father helped form the Grand Forks branch of the National Brotherhood of Christian and Jew and was their vice chairman for several years, with Rev. Homer Harrington of the Episcopal Church as chairman and Dr. Irvin Lavine as secretary. He was one of the principal speakers when the National Brotherhood Week was celebrated with a state meeting and banquet in Grand Forks, February 27, 1938, and again in April of 1939.
