Ken Capalbo, O.F.M., served as Chair of the Division of History and Social Science at Quincy University before his election to leadership as Provincial Vicar of the Province of the Most Sacred Heart in 1999. Most recently he has been Visiting Professor at the Franciscan Institute in Ho Chi Minh City (Saigon), Vietnam. He studied medieval history at Cambridge under Walter Ullmann and C.N.L. Brooke. In research and teaching he has pursued themes in ecclesiological thought, the Franciscan movement, and reform.
