

Rite of Scrutinies use Cycle A Readings while we are currently in Cycle B; therefore the readings for the Masses are different.

Introductions to Readings...by Bishop Ken Untener, In collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor

First Reading - Jeremiah 31:31-34....The prophet Jeremiah ministered at a difficult time in Jewish history. Jerusalem, their beloved capitol, had been destroyed, and most of the people taken captive to far-off Babylon. In this gloomy setting, Jeremiah expresses the conviction that the Lord will raise up a new leader from the line of David to restore and rebuild their homeland.

Second Reading - Hebrews 5:7-9....The Letter to the Hebrews was written to a Christian community that had become dispirited and whose faith was faltering. Jesus is presented in today's passage as a model of suffering and a source of strength in time of need. (This passage is also part of the second reading on Good Friday.)

Third Scrutiny Readings

First Reading - Ezekiel 37:12-14....The prophet Ezekiel spoke to God's people during their exile in Babylon, six centuries before Christ. In today's passage, the prophet (using the image of death and resurrection) assures the people that God will one day bring them back to their homeland.

Second Reading - Romans 8:8-11....Paul's letter to the Romans is his most detailed and important theological work. Throughout the letter, he teaches that Jesus overcame sin and the effects of sin. In today's passage, Paul stresses that through the Spirit, this saving power of Jesus is present and active in Christians of all times and places.





Tofu Crumble and **Black Bean Tacos**

SERVES: 6 PREP: 5 min COOK: 40 min TOTAL: 45 min



Ingredients:

- 2 10-Ounce Blocks Super Firm Tofu **See notes
- 1/4 Cup Taco Seasoning
- 2 Tbls. Soy Sauce, Tamari, or Liquid Aminos
- 1 Tbls. Cornstarch
- 1 15 ounce Can Black Beans, drained & rinsed

To Serve: Tortillas or Taco Shells, Lettuce, Tomato, Red Onion, Vegan Sour Cream, Red Pepper Flakes, etc

Instructions: Preheat the oven to 375°F. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. If using extra firm tofu instead of super firm, press the tofu using a tofu press or place it under a heavy object for at least 10 minutes. In a medium bowl, use your hands to crumble tofu into small pieces. Add the soy sauce and taco seasoning, and toss to combine. Sprinkle the cornstarch over the tofu and toss again. Spread the tofu on the prepared baking sheet and bake for 30 minutes, stirring halfway through. Remove from the oven and add the black beans. Return to the oven for another 10 minutes. Serve with your favorite taco fixings. Enjoy!

AED Devices Now Available! (Automated External Defibrillator)



We now have pads for adults and children ages 0-8 for use with the AED devices. The AED units are available in the church, the Hall & the PAC.

- Church AED located on the wall to the right of the entrance to the kitchen.
- PAC AED located on the left (west) wall of the gathering space.
- Hall AED located on the north wall (straight ahead) of the main room.

You don't need training to use these devices as they are designed to talk you through deployment and assess whether shock is needed.


