

First Reading Acts 3:13-15, 17-19

Chapter three of the Acts of the Apostles describes how Peter and John healed a lame man who sat begging each day at the gate of the temple. The people were astonished at this miracle. Peter used the opportunity to give a sermon encouraging the people to believe in Jesus. We hear a portion of that sermon now.

Second Reading - 1 John 2:1-5

Each Sunday during this Easter Season, we are reading from the first letter of John. It was written for the community from which the fourth Gospel emerged. At the time, this community was seriously divided. Some members believed that as long as you had faith in Jesus, it didn't matter what you did in daily life. Today's passage deals with that issue.

She now serves her home diocese of Columbus, Ohio as a Master Catechist and her parish as a lector, liturgical ministry mentor, cantor and accompanist. 

A Special Wish Foundation of Southwest Ohio...

Matt Slone, son of Linda Slone-Former VBS Director-is passionate about dancing, musicals, and theater, but he's also a big believer in giving back to his community. And now he gets to combine all of these passions as he participates in Dancing with the Dayton Stars, a fundraising event organized by A Special Wish Foundation of Southwest Ohio. A Special Wish Foundation works similarly to the Make-a -Wish Foundation, except that they work more locally-partnering with the communities where the kids live. Their mission is to grant the wishes of children up to age 20 who have been diagnosed with a life-threatening disorder. Every year, the foundation puts on its biggest fundraising event, Dancing with the Dayton Stars, where amateur dancers who are active in the Dayton community pair up with a

ballroom specialist from Arthur Murray Dayton Dance Center and compete raise money for the foundation. As a former teacher, Matt saw firsthand the impact of A Special Wish Foundation. A seven-year-old girl in his school district was diagnosed with leukemia, and she wanted to meet a horse. Because of the seriousness of her condition, it seemed like her wish couldn't come true, but with the help from the foundation and doctors at Dayton Children's Hospital, a local ranch brought a horse to the parking lot of the hospital. The girl was able to pet and groom the horse. "You can see this organization really makes a difference for kids. It has such a positive impact," Slone said. Slone and his dance partner are currently practicing for the big day and are planning on dancing to a song from "Beetlejuice" with costumes and everything – another nod to his passion for theater. The event will be held at The Mandalay in Moraine, OH on April 27.


