

First Reading - Deuteronomy 26:4-10

The events in this reading take place as the Israelites are camped on the shore of the Jordan River ready to enter the Promised Land. Moses bids them to remember all that God has done for them. When they are settled in this new land, he tells them that every year they should offer the first fruits of their harvest to the Lord.

Second Reading - Romans 10:8-13

Paul was proud of his Jewish heritage and wanted all his people to be saved. The question of what will happen to Jews who do not believe in Jesus caused Paul a great deal of grief and anxiety. In this section of the letter to the Romans, he addresses this issue.



Lenten Recipe Corner...

This Vegan Lasagna layers sheets of pasta, lentil meat sauce, and creamy tofu ricotta for a comforting dish made with



whole food ingredients. Perfect for a Friday Lenten meal. Thank you God for this comforting food that nourishes us, body and soul. Let this food fill us and keep us healthy. Amen. Ingredients:

- 12 Lasagna Noodles
- 4 Cups Fresh Spinach
- Vegan Mozzarella, Fresh Basil Leaves & Vegan Parmesan, optional

Lentil Meat Sauce:

- 1 Large Yellow Onion, small diced
- 8 Ounces Cremini Mushrooms, chopped (optional)
- 1 Head Garlic, about 12 cloves, minced
- 1 28 Ounce Can Crushed Tomatoes
- 2 Cups Water
- 3/3 Cup Black Beluga Lentils
- 3 Tablespoons Tomato Paste
- 1 Tbsp Onion Powder & 1 Tbsp Garlic Powder
- 2 tsp Dried Oregano & 2 tsp Dried Basil
- 1 tsp Dried Thyme, 1 ½ tsp Salt & ¼ tsp Black Pepper

Tofu Ricotta:

- 1 14 Ounce Block Extra Firm Tofu & 8 Ounces Silken Tofu
- 2 Tbsp Nutritional Yeast & 1 Tbsp Apple Cider Vinegar
- 1 tsp Garlic Powder & 1 1/2 tsp Salt

Instructions: Preheat the oven to 350°F. Make the sauce. In a large skillet over medium heat, sauté the onion, mushrooms, and garlic for 5 minutes, until fragrant. Add the crushed tomatoes, water, lentils, tomato paste, onion powder, garlic powder, oregano, basil, thyme, salt, and pepper. Stir to combine, then bring to a simmer, cover partially, and cook for 30-35 minutes until the lentils are just tender. (It's okay if the lentils aren't *totally* cooked, since they will be baked again in the oven.) Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil. Cook the lasagna noodles until just al dente, or according to the package directions. If your noodles say "no boil" boil the noodles anyway, for 4-5 minutes, until flexible. Drain and set aside on a tray, plate or towel in a single layer. Make the vegan ricotta. Pulse all the ricotta ingredients in a food processor, until combined. Spread 1 ¼ cup of the lentil sauce into the bottom of a casserole dish. Layer on three lasagna noodles. Add one third of the tofu ricotta. Then add a third of the spinach. Repeat this process twice - sauce, noodles, ricotta, spinach. Finally, add the remaining three noodles and remaining sauce (should be about ½ cup). Cover the dish with foil and bake for 30-35 minutes. If desired, remove the foil and pour on the vegan mozzarella. Broil 5-7 minutes, until the cheese sets and is beginning to brown. Let cool for 10-15 minutes before slicing. Top with vegan parmesan if desire Garnish with cilantro and serve with pita bread and a lime wedge.

RCIA - Rite of Sending / Rite of Election / Call to Continuing Conversion Holy Family is celebrating the Rite of Sending at the 10:30 AM Mass today.

This is a very significant step in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. The desire of our catechumens and candidates to continue in the RCIA process is affirmed by their sponsors and they are 'sent' to celebrate the Rite of Election (catechumens) and the Call to Continuing Conversion (candidates).



The catechumens - now known as the elect - publicly acknowledge their desire to receive the Sacraments of Initiation, and the candidates' desire to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church. This ceremony will be celebrated this afternoon at 2:00 PM at Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception Church on Smithville Road in Dayton.

Who is responsible for the RCIA catechumens and candidates who are seeking to be fully initiated into the Catholic Church? WE ALL ARE!

We are asked to pray for them, to give them good example and support. Bringing new members into the Church is part of what we are commissioned to do by Christ through our baptism.

Our faith is a gift, not for us alone, but for all. It is for us to share!


St Vincent de Paul Pantry **Requesting Toiletry Donations**

Health Ministry: It's Not Too Late to Begin to Observe Lent



Although Lent officially began days ago we can begin participating any time. Now would be good. The ways to observe are many: *Fasting lets us practice letting go and pushes

us to resist consumer culture, the cult of "bigger-faster-more." Lent helps us see where our wants have been distorted into needs.

*Be selfless; reflect on the suffering of the poor and what you can do to help them.

*Decrease focus on self and start something new to spread love and kindness. Send some handwritten notes or say a prayer for someone each day or perform random acts of kindness.

*Give up morning stress; say a short prayer to reflect on all God has provided and give thanks.

*Give up judgment, complaining, worry, regret, and gossip or at least attempt to decrease. Lent is about our relationship with Christ; and that relationship, like our ordinary relationships with other people, has seasons of trial and deprivation as well as seasons of joy. Lent
