In the latter years of the first century, when the first letter to Timothy was written, Church leaders were concerned that Christianity not be seen as opposed to the good order of society. So, today's passage pictures Paul exhorting Timothy to lead an upright life.



Health Ministry:

6 Fall Prevention Steps

1)Enlist their support in taking simple steps to stay safe. Many older adults recognize that falling is a risk, but they believe it won't happen to them.

2) Discuss their current health conditions. Find out if your older loved one is experiencing any problems with managing their own health.

3)Ask about their last eye checkup. If your older loved one wears glasses, make sure they have a current prescription and they're using the glasses as advised by their eye doctor.

4) Notice if they're holding onto walls, furniture, or someone else when walking or if they appear to have difficulty walking. These are all signs that it might be time to see a physical therapist.

5)Talk about their medications. Beware of non -prescription medications that contain sleep aids-including painkillers with "PM" in their names. These can lead to balance issues and dizziness.

6)Do a walk-through safety assessment of their home. Increase lighting throughout the house, make sure there are two secure rails on all stairs, install grab bars in the tub/shower. https://www.ncoa.org/article/6-fallsprevention-steps-to-help-your-older-loved-ones





Changes Coming to Scheduling Mass Intentions...This summer,

Holy Name lost the Saturday evening vigil Mass, so we currently have only one Mass on the weekend. At one time, we had 3 weekend Masses, but now we only have one. Also, we only have three weekday Masses, but one day per week generally has been assigned to the Purgatorial Society, which just allows 2 weekday Masses for individual Mass intentions. We try our best to accommodate all Mass intention requests, but we are simply restricted by the number of Masses available. Therefore, we need to set up some guidelines for everyone. These guidelines do not include Masses for the recently deceased.

Guidelines Include: (1) limit the number of Sunday Mass intentions to 3. (2) Requests are on a "first come, first served" basis. (3) Please limit the number of weekday Mass intentions to no more than 8 per year. Masses already promised and scheduled will not be affected. FY 2024-25 OLOS Annual Report... Wondering how the parish did financially over the last year? Check out the Annual Report insert in the bulletin this weekend, and available in the Gathering Space after that. There are 2 sides to the report. The side that contains the financial statement contains all the information required by the Document on Temporal Affairs. On this side, you will see that there was an overall surplus of \$92,951 for the fiscal year that started July 1, 2024 & ended June 30, 2025. Collections ticked up in November and the trend continued through April. At the same time, a position budgeted to be shared between the Our Lady of Peace Family of Parishes was not filled. The parish also took a withdrawal from the Frances Paul Trust to replace 6 HVAC systems in the church and to install new railings on the West side of the church. At the time of the withdrawal in October, it was not anticipated that we would have such a large surplus at the end of the year. Without the funds from the Frances Paul Trust the surplus would have been a much more modest \$14,550. We typically have only taken withdrawals from the Trust for large maintenance or construction projects, as was the case with the HVAC project. If you take a look at the other side, you will see more information and a breakdown of the results. The Our Lady of Sorrows Staff and Finance Council (made up of parishioners) work to be good stewards of parish resources. If you have questions about the Annual Report, contact Ava in the office. 




