

Calvary Cemetery Collection

On a hill in Ireland, overlooking the rolling green landscape just northwest of Dublin, there is a tomb. It is a huge mound, covered with grass and faced with white quartz. It's not alone: at least 35 smaller, similar tombs can be found nearby.

Within a day or two of the winter solstice, the rising sun pierces the mound, dramatically illuminating its central burial chambers. The remains of five individuals have been discovered there and it has been suggested from DNA analysis that at least one may been a king or prince. Newgrange, as it is called, was built approximately 500 years before the Great Pyramid of Egypt, and a thousand years before it Neolithic British neighbor, Stonehenge. Fast-forward to the more recent past. Not quite two hundred years ago, the prosperity and grandeur of ancient Ireland had been replaced by a desperate time: The Great Famine. The potato crop, a staple for Irish farmers, was infected with a disease that devastated the plants on which rural residents depended for survival. About one million died of starvation and related diseases. Almost twice that emigrated, many to American.

If you take a quiet hour to wander through our Calvary Cemetery, you will see the graves of many individuals whose birthplaces in Ireland are listed: Donegal, Taum, Tipperary. To them the famine was not just history-it was a memory. A drama that played out in the shadow of burial mounds like the ones in Newgrange.

Newgrange is just one of many examples throughout prehistory which prove that commemorating our deceased loved ones is not a new phenomenon. Newgrange fell into disrepair over the millennia and has been restored to what scholars believe was its original appearance. Some burial places aren't so fortunate, and it's up to the living to maintain them. And so once again at this time of year when we remember the dead-and incidentally, Halloween has its roots in ancient Ireland-we ask for your contributions to help us maintain the grounds of Calvary Cemetery-our own way of honoring our loved ones and their past.

Stewardship: Giving Time, Talent & Treasure as a Way of Life




