

First Reading - Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12

Ezekiel, an Old Testament prophet who ministered to the Jewish people exiled in Babylon, shared a vision that spoke not only of the restoration of Jerusalem and its Temple, but of an abundance of life like never seen before.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 3:9c-11, 16-17

Paul tells the believers at Corinth that they are "God's building" and that their "foundation" is "Jesus Christ." Addressing divisions that centered on the authority of various leaders within the community, Paul states unequivocally that their only foundation is Jesus Christ.




Prayer of Gertrude The Great...




